Neperud Cracks WU Javelin Standard

McMINNVILLE (Special)—Williamette's Bearcats made an impressive debut in 1952 dual meet action Friday as they rolled to a 93 1/2 to 37 1/2 victory over the Linfield Wildcats in a battle featured by a javelin toss of 206 feet, 4 inches by the Bearcats' Stan Neperud.

Neperud, sophomore from Silverton, established a new Williamette mark with his mighty toss, topping the former school record of 203'7" made last season by teammate Bob Hall.

Coach Chester Stackhouse's Methodists captured 10 of the 15 events, with Bill Van Horn taking two wins as he finished first in both the century and the 220. A strong wind held down times.

Grant Schiewe of Linfield was a double winner in the high and low hurdles.

One of the better times was the Freshman Ralph Adams 4:40 figure in the mile for WU.

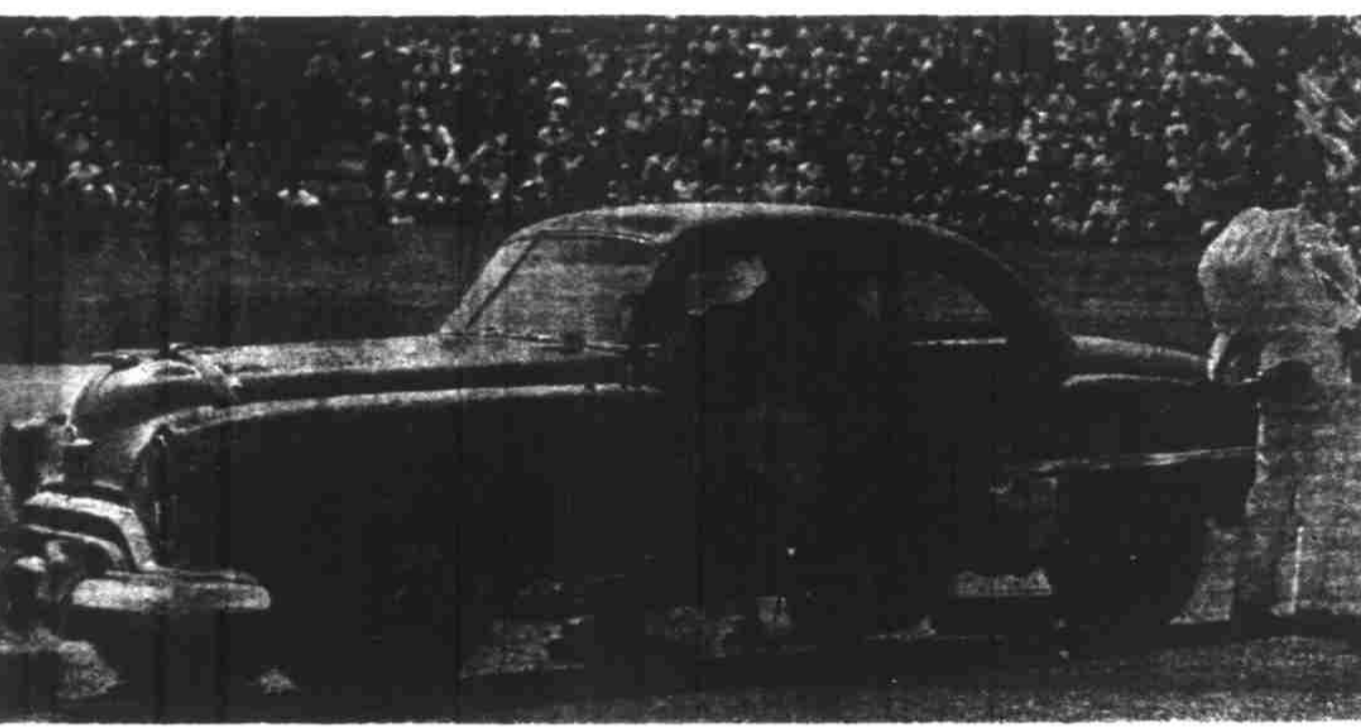
