Driftwood Mahogany Finish is Good Choice for Young Married Couples

A fresh new collection of light furniture in a new driftwood mahogany finish is a good choice for young couples planning their first home. A moderately priced line, the collection, called "Bali-Hi" by its designer, Merton L. Gershun, has many good wearing features, such as drawers permanently treated to prevent swelling or sticking. The wood is a bleached mahogany, but has depth in undertones of brown in the simulated bamboo fronts of the case goods and the caning of the bedroom headboards.

Light woods have been the choice of many young couples because one dusting a day is all they need, and they seldom show scratches or other signs of wear—a boon to the housewife who works at a job, and takes care of her home as well. The whole collection of bedroom, living and

dining room pieces has been correlated so that many of the units can be interchanged at will. Among the dual purpose pieces is a buffet with six drawers and a cabinet that looks equally well in bedroom, living or dining room. It can be the main starter for a couple whose first home is a one room apartment because its ample storage room is disguised in a handsome front. There is no hardware on the Bali-Hi line. Drawers have side finger holes or small wood pulls.

On two of the designs, a compact server with two doors and a nest of tables, a spill-resistant cork has been used. A small patterned fabric appears on the dining room chairs and on living room sofas. The dining chairs have caned backs and can be had with or without arms. The whole collection has an informal South Sea feeling that lends itself to a variety of decoration ideas for moderns.
