VIENNA (INS)—The American members of the four-power International Patrol in Vienna recently voted Hollywood starlet Debbie Reynolds as "the girl we'd

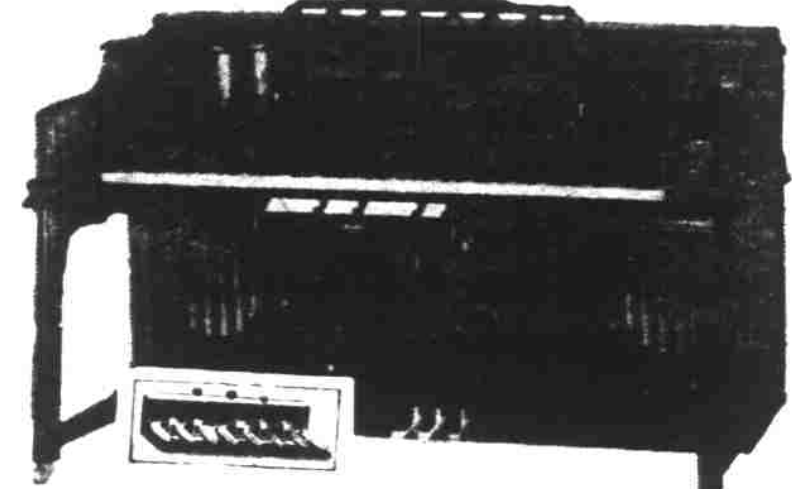
most like to patrol with." Should Miss Reynolds ever consider accepting the invitation Russian members of the patrol are expected to put up no vetoes.

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
