

Russ Churches Try to Unite Red Peace Bid

ZAGORSK, USSR (AP) — The leading churchmen of the Soviet Union sought Friday to rally all churches and faiths of the country to the Communist peace campaign. White-bearded Nikolai, Russian Orthodox Metropolitan Bishop of Moscow, denounced the United Nations as an instrument of war in a 90-minute address to scores of prelates and representatives of Russia's numerous religions. Patriarch Alexei, head of the Orthodox Church in all Russia, who presided, likewise declared germ warfare in Korea and China must be "condemned by every religious person in every land."

This city of cathedrals, 50 miles north of Moscow, was chosen as the site of the conference because it is the heart of Russian Orthodoxy.

Aged Portlander Plunges to Death

PORTLAND (AP) — An 82-year-old man jumped 19 feet from the St. John's bridge to his death in the Willamette River here Friday. He was identified as W. H. Richardson, a retired farmer of South Bend, Wash., who had been visiting his two sons here recently. The widow said Richardson had been in poor health recently.

Ike to Pass Up Campaign

Gen. Eisenhower said again Friday night he does not plan to make any campaign for the Republican presidential nomination, while Sen. Taft said he has almost completed his campaign.

"If the people want me for President, they will know where to find me," Eisenhower told reporters in Oslo, Norway.

Except for a long-planned speech at Abilene, Kas., on June 4, Eisenhower said he has no plans for other speeches in this country. Making a farewell tour of North Atlantic Treaty countries, the General told newsmen:

"I have said before and I say now that I do not plan to make any campaign."

Hill Gail Out Of Preakness

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Hill Gail, the Kentucky Derby winner, was declared out of the Preakness Friday because of an ankle condition. Trainer Ben Jones of Calumet Farm announced the colt also will have to pass up the Belmont Stakes which follows the May 17 Preakness.

Jones said a superficial growth on the left front ankle will have to be "fired," racing men's term for burning out the growth with an electric needle.

YW Campaign Tops \$100,000

Salem YWCA has pushed its current building fund campaign just over the \$100,000 mark, General Chairman A. C. Haag reported Friday.

With \$200,000 raised earlier, this brings the fund to within \$100,000 of the amount needed to erect the proposed new YWCA building on the site of the present overcrowded YW at State St.

One of the special contributions noted as campaign leaders gathered for a buffet luncheon at the YW Friday noon is a \$500 donation from Zonta, a local women's service organization.

Haag called on campaigners to redouble their efforts and report back on May 23. The meeting was presided over by Mrs. A. A. Schramm and was addressed by Mrs. H. G. Maison, longtime YW leader who recalled the difficulties of the Y's first campaign which resulted in purchase of the old residence now in use by the Y.

Judge Links Freedom Of Speech and Press
