Rev. Robinson held pastorates at Brownsville and Turner before going to LaGrande and was a student at Northwest Christian College and the University of Oregon.

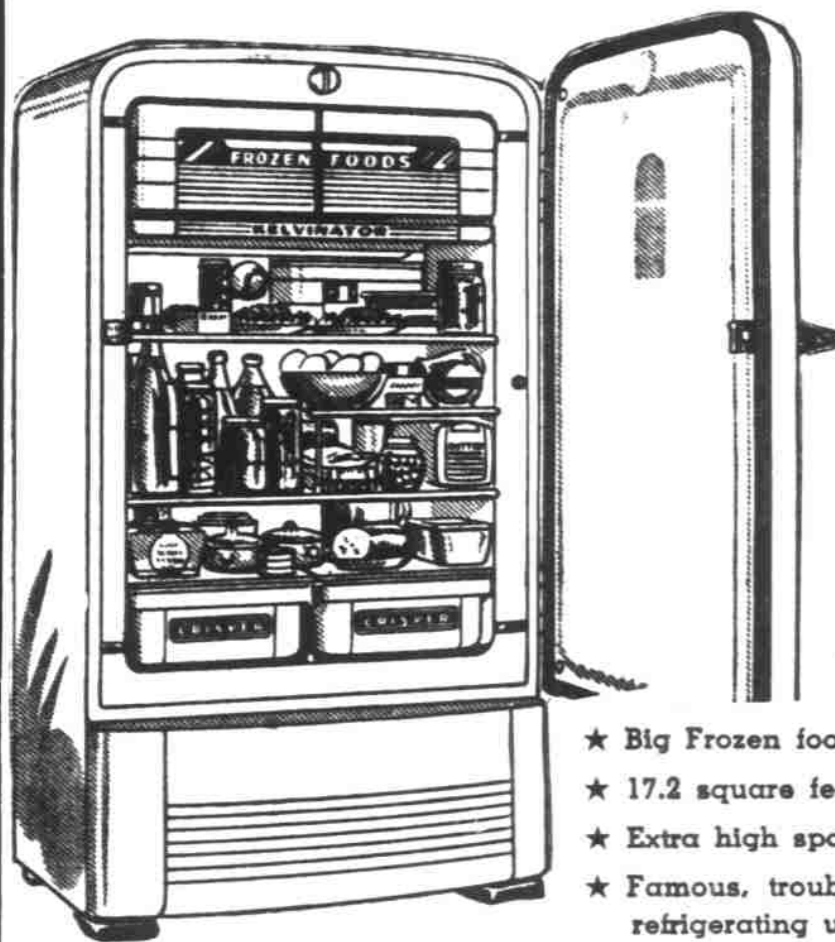
John Goodnecht, Waldo Hills Farmer in Hospital
