

## First Nazarene Will Note 40th Year on Sunday

First Church of the Nazarene will celebrate its 40th anniversary in Salem Sunday. Five special services have been planned, according to the pastor, Rev. Eugene Stowe.

At the Sunday school, former superintendents of the school will speak briefly.

Dr. B. V. Seals, superintendent of the Washington-Pacific District of the church, will speak at the 10:50 a. m. worship service.

Dr. Fletcher Galloway, pastor here from 1931 to 1934 and new pastor of Portland First Church, will speak at 3 p. m. Mrs. J. T. Little, wife of the first full-time pastor of the church, will be introduced.

A combined service of all the youth groups of the church at 6:30 p. m. will hear the Rev. W. D. McGraw Jr., superintendent of the Oregon-Pacific District. Dr. Seals will bring the concluding sermon of the day at the 7:30 p. m. evangelistic service.

Special music throughout the day will be supplied by the Lacy Colored Gospel Singers of Pasadena, Calif.

Salem Church of the Nazarene was organized May 26, 1912. Its meeting place was the WCTU Hall at Commercial and Ferry Streets, now occupied by The Statesman circulation department. Fifteen members signed the charter and 25 attended the first Sunday school session. The first church building was erected at 19th and Breyman Streets. In 1931, the German Methodist Church at 13th and Center Streets was purchased. It was remodeled and enlarged as the present home of the church. Membership is 407, with an average Sunday school attendance of 400. Church property, including the new educational unit, is evaluated at \$135,000.

## Italian Church Trainer Slated Here Monday

Salem Christian Business Men's Committee will sponsor the Rev. Anthony Caliendo, trainer of ministers in Italy, at a city-wide meeting Monday at 7:45 p. m. in Salem Academy gymnasium.

Caliendo was born in Italy and educated there. He attended schools in New York and New Jersey, and received his B. Sc. and M. A. degrees from New York University. His theological training was at the Biblical Seminary in New York City.

In 1934 he received the American University Award of the Italian government for his proficiency in the field of Italian language, literature and cultural relations between Italians and Americans.

For 12 years, Caliendo was director of Christ's Mission in New York City. He served on the faculty of the Senior High School in Montclair, N. J., as professor of Italian for 16 years. He taught Americanization and civics to Italian immigrants.

Caliendo in 1947 was sent as an ambassador of good will by the Italian Ministerial Association of Greater New York City and by the American Committee for Evangelical Relief to Italy. He is now dedicating his full time and energy to seminary work in Italy at the Evangelical Biblical Institute, Naples.

Caliendo has contributed many articles to religious and educational journals, such as World Outlook and United Evangelical Action, The Churchman, The Gospel Witness and Protestant Advocate, and The Watchman-Examiner.

He is vice-president of the National Evangelical Relief for Italy, vice president of the American Committee for Religious Freedom in Italy, and in this connection spoke before the Foreign Relations Committee of the U. S. Senate in 1947.

## Jason Lee Pupils' Pilgrimage To Statue, Cemetery Sunday

Program for the annual Memorial Sunday pilgrimage by children of Jason Lee Methodist Church Sunday school was announced Friday, as well as guest speaker for the 11 a. m. service.

## Trever, Authority On Bible, Due in Oregon for Week

Dr. John C. Trever, nationally known Bible authority and member of the American Revision Committee of the Old Testament, will be in Oregon next week for a series of speaking engagements under the auspices of the Oregon Council of Churches.

Dr. Trever will begin in Baker on Sunday and during the week will speak at Pendleton, La Grande, Portland, Eugene, Albany and Corvallis. He will show pictures on his Bible discoveries. In connection with his message in each city, Dr. Trever will tell of the progress being made toward the completion of the American Revised Version of the entire Bible, which will appear next September 30.
