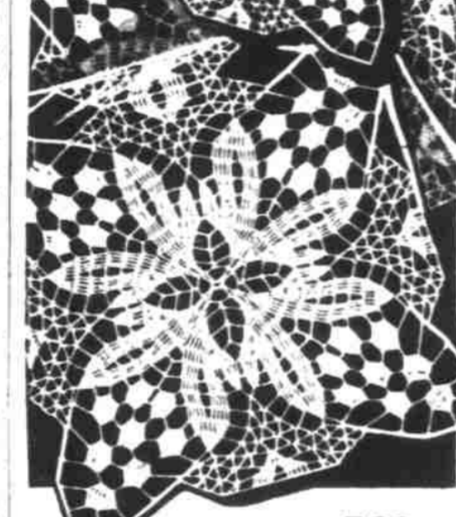
Final Spring Meetings Listed
