

Stock Market Prices Rise

NEW YORK (AP)—Stock prices advanced Monday on a late flurry of buying that gave the only lull to a listless market. Demand in the final minutes of trading centered on railroad issues, but also gave an added lift to several chemicals. Gains ran from a few cents to more than a dollar a share. The improvement was just enough to push the Associated Press average of 60 stocks ahead 40 cents at \$103.50, where it equaled its high for nearly 22 years. This level had been touched previously last Thursday and before that on March 31 this year. Utilities in the average, with a gain of 30 cents, touched a new 1932 high at \$52.40; rails were up 30 cents and industrials 40 cents. Transactions amounted to 930,000 shares.

Grain Prices Slide Lower

CHICAGO (AP)—Grains slid lower in a rather listless market on the board of trade Monday. They were marked down at the start and never rallied enough to get above Saturday's finish. Wheat closed $\frac{3}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ lower, corn 1 cent lower to $\frac{1}{4}$ higher, oats unchanged to $\frac{1}{4}$ lower, rye $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ lower and soybeans $\frac{3}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ lower and lard unchanged to 5 cents a hundred pounds higher. Main reason for the selling in wheat was the receipt of fair to good rains over the entire wheat producing districts of Western Canada, plus some showers in the northwestern spring wheat belt.

To Show Emergency Routes

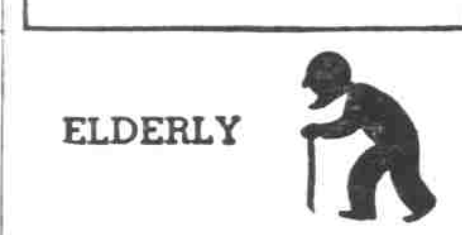

Voice of America Refuses to Beam Ball Scores to Europe

WASHINGTON (AP)—The "Voice of America" reported Sunday it does not plan to broadcast baseball scores to Europe each day. And somewhere two Swedes and one Frenchman will be sad. According to Eddy Gilmore, Associated Press correspondent in Moscow, these two Swedes and one Frenchman are redhot baseball fans, and think the "Voice of America" should come through with the scores. This came up in a dispatch sent by Gilmore from Moscow. The dispatch started out routinely enough. It quoted A. Puzin, chairman of the committee on radio information of the council of ministers. It seems Puzin doesn't like the "Voice of America," the State Department's overseas short-wave radio. "The American and British radio broadcasts are a filthy stream of war propaganda," Puzin said. "They are constant intimidations of the people with the atomic bomb." "They are lies and slanders prepared on a gigantic scale in the bourgeois propaganda kitchen. Gilmore's story went along for a page and a half, and then suddenly switched to baseball. He said an unidentified Frenchman once told him: "I cannot understand the policy of the Voice of America's English language broadcasts. Obviously they are designed for English speaking people in Europe and elsewhere. What then interests English speaking people abroad more than baseball?" Gilmore said he also had talked to a couple of Swedes, who asked: "Don't they think any people in Europe—especially those who speak English—are interested in baseball?" This question was dutifully relayed along to the "Voice of America." Its reply: No. The fellow over there wouldn't let me use his name, but he said the "Voice" did send baseball scores to Latin America and to Japan, where baseball is played. But he said the "Voice" people hadn't noticed any interest at all in baseball scores in Europe. The fellow then remembered that Gilmore used to be in Washington. Hadn't he been a great follower of the Washington Senators then? "And aren't the Senators doing exceptionally well this year?" Yes. "Hmmm," said the voice of the "Voice." But he didn't change his stand. So two Swedes, one Frenchman

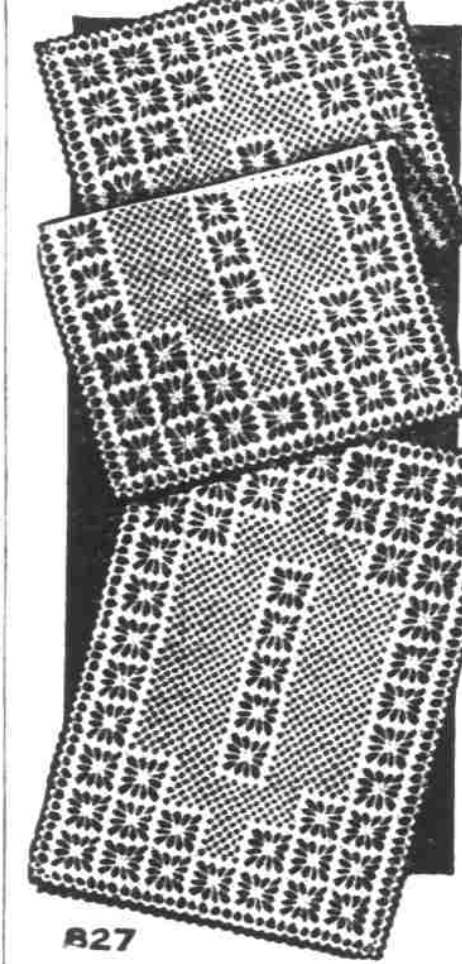
