Correspondence Study Attracts Many in Salem

Salem's 230 registrants for evening and correspondence study under the State System of Higher Education comprised the second largest group outside Portland. That registration, by 52 men and 178 women, was recorded during the winter term, which Chancellor Charles D. Byrne said showed an upward trend this year. Eugene's roll exceeded Salem's.

Enrollment for the term in 47 towns totaled 2,372 students taking 7,162 hours of work, 2,704 students in Portland Extension Center and 658 new correspondence students added to the approximately 3,500 already listed.

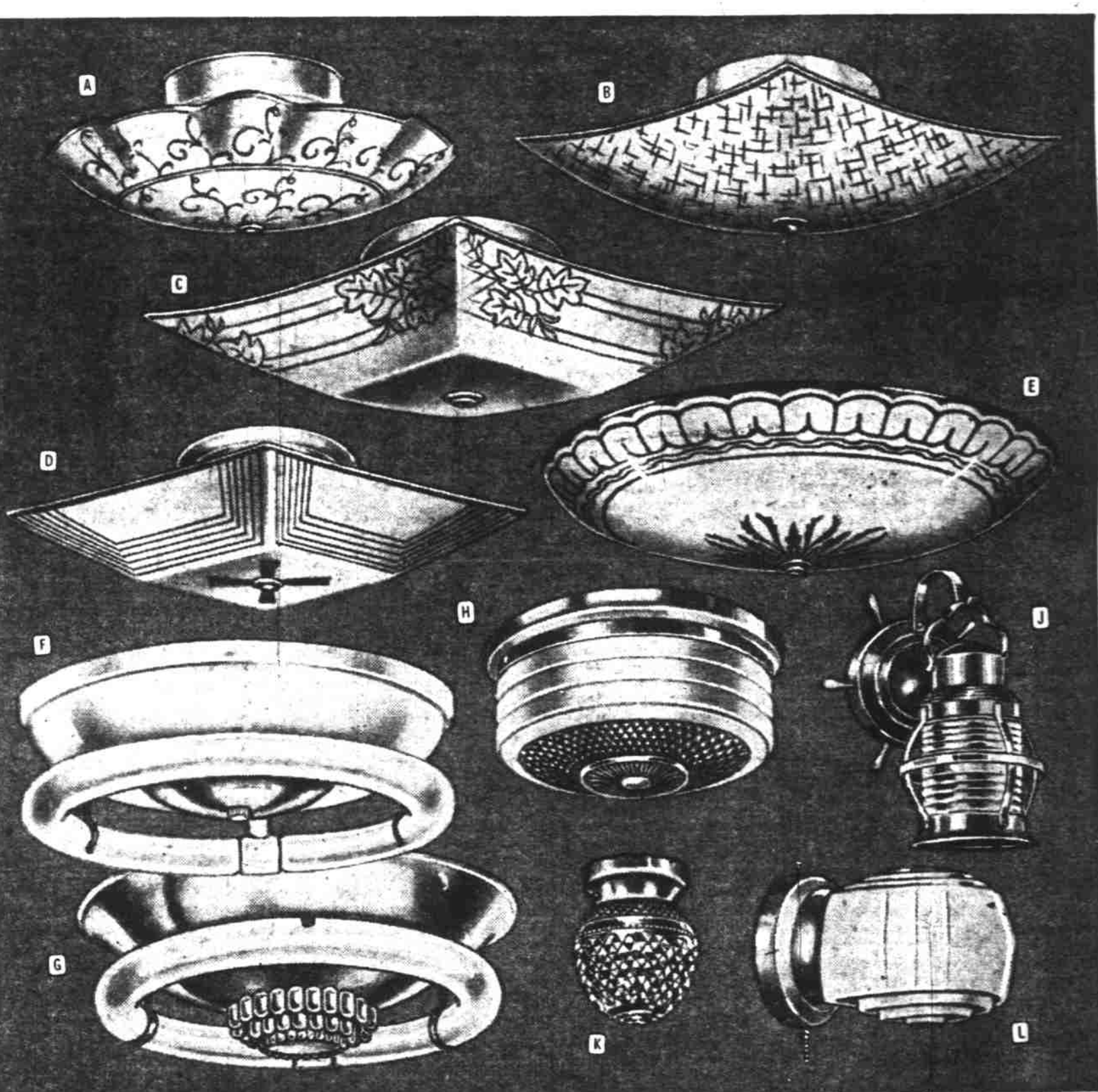
