Dr. Lindstrom has testified that the Italian who wooed away his wife "has a reputation as a drug addict and a habit of living with mistresses who are married to other men."

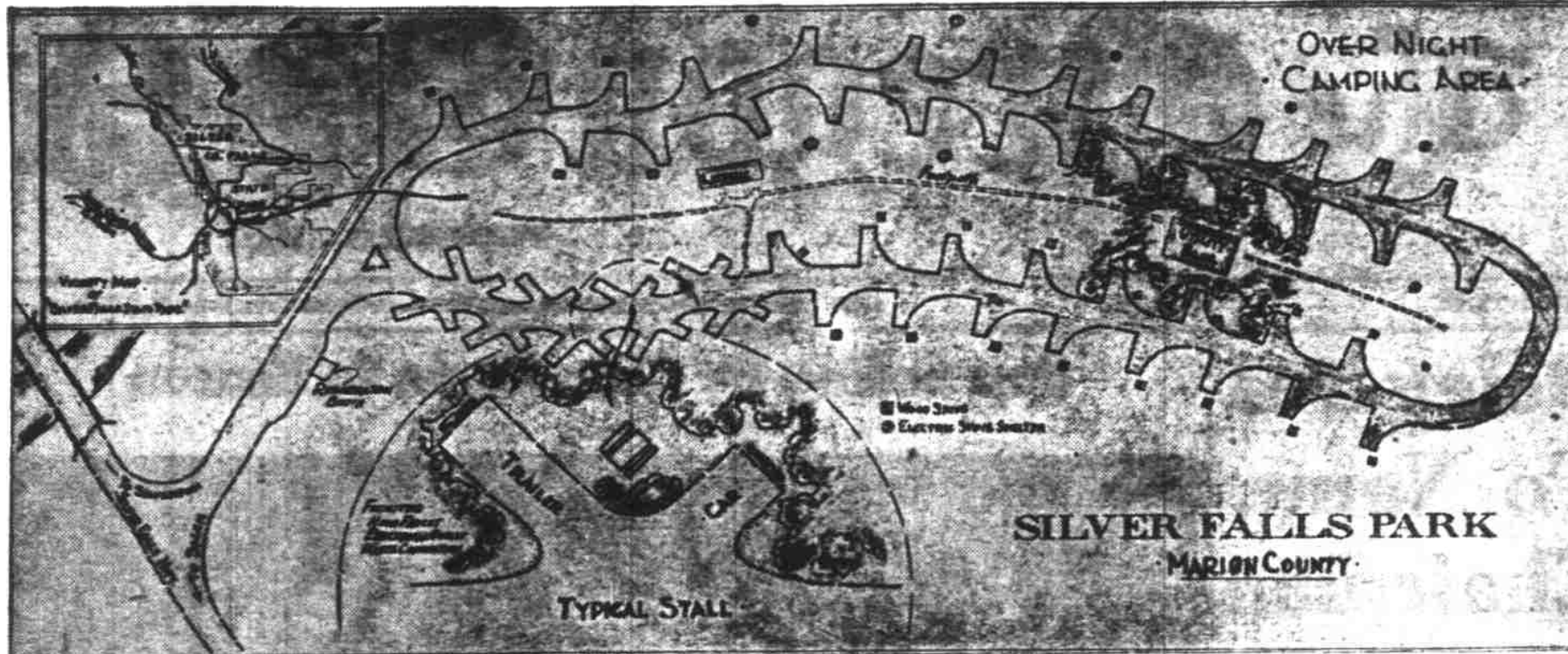

The State Highway Commission's overnight camping program, developed through its Parks Department, now includes two improved and tent sites at Silver Falls State Park (sketch above) in Marion County, the other at Wallowa Lake Park in Wallowa County. Also there are 40 tent campsites at Silver Creek, 47 at Wallowa, and each campsite also has restrooms, showers and laundry facilities. Rates are \$1 a night.

## Son Joins Vigil At Bedside of Fasting Father

CHERRYVILLE, Mo. (AP) The Army son of the fasting Ozark preacher returned home Friday from Korea to join five other children in their vigil over their weakening father.

The Rev. J. J. Ivie claims to have been without food now for 47 days.

Pfc Marvin Ivie, 23, arrived in St. Louis by plane and was driven home by members of the family. He had been in Korea about 11 months and was sped back with Red Cross help at Mrs. Ivie's request.

Mrs. Ivie said her husband, 57, an Assembly of God minister, continues to weaken physically, although his mental processes appear normal.

She said he spends most of his time in prayer on his bed, waiting a message from God.

## Count Error Adds for Taft

SIoux FALLS, S. D. (AP)—An error discovered by one county auditor Friday helped Sen. Robert A. Taft of Ohio improve his South Dakota primary election lead over Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower for 14 presidential delegates.

The Hutchinson County auditor, Eugene Koerner, reported he discovered an error in the unofficial poll book which gave Taft an additional 16 votes and took 91 away from Eisenhower.

The vote change in itself was not significant, but it indicated that material changes in the vote could be possible when the official county canvass is made Saturday. Taft is now leading by 820 votes. With the change, the unofficial tabulation gave Taft 64,840, Eisenhower 64,020.

## Reds Warned By Ridgway

STE. MERE EGLISE, France (AP)—Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway declared in a D-Day anniversary speech Friday the West would suffer dreadfully if Communist chief-tains started a new war, "but it would bring destruction to them and their power."

Speaking at Utah Beach, Ridgway said: "The last time I came here, I came as one of the thousands to wage war. This time I come to wage peace."

He referred to "the illimitable reservoirs of our own strength" and suggested the lords of Communism should not interpret the West's patience and tolerance as signs of weakness or a declining civilization.

## 35 Doctorate Degrees Set at Oregon State

CORVALLIS—An all-time record number of doctor's degrees will be conferred at the 83rd annual commencement exercises at Oregon State College Monday at 10 a.m.

Of the 35 doctor's degrees to be granted, 31 are doctor of philosophy degrees—the highest academic degree attainable—and four doctor of education degrees. A total of 1,197 students are candidates for degrees. Of this number 993 are candidates for bachelor degrees.

Both the graduation exercises and the baccalaureate services Sunday at 11 a.m. will be held again this year in the OSC coliseum. Dr. Ralph C. Walker, pastor of the First Baptist Church, Portland, will deliver the baccalaureate sermon.

Following a long-standing custom at OSC, there will be no main commencement speaker, but Al L. Three former Oregon State classes will hold reunions in connection with commencement week end. These are the classes of 1902 which with all classes previous to that time form the Golden Jubilee Association, the 40-year-class of 1912 and the silver jubilee group of 1917.

The school of engineering will have the largest number of graduates with 207. Business and technology ranks second with 168, followed by agriculture with 173, science 134, education 116, home economics 71, forestry 61, pharmacy 54 and nursing education 9.

## Western Union Asks to Boost Telegram Cost

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Western Union Telegraph Co. Friday asked government permission to boost its domestic telegram and money order rates to an average of 9 3/4 cents so it can give its workers a pay boost.

It asked the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) for increases which would generally add from 5 to 10 cents to the present cost of sending a 15-word telegram.

The higher rates will go into effect in a month, on July 6, unless the commission holds they are unreasonable.

## Unknown Tops In Pentathlon

WEST POINT, N. Y. (AP)—Pfc. Thad McArthur of Seattle, a dark-horse in pre-trials consideration, went into the lead of the United States pentathlon championships and Olympic trials Friday by winning the 4,000-meter cross-country run. With one event to go in the five-event sport competition, McArthur holds a slim one-point lead with 16 points. Capt. Guy Troy of St. Petersburg, Fla., slipped to second place with 17 when he wound up eighth in the race over the Olympics-approximated course at the military academy golf links.

McArthur's time for the grind, which is about two and one-half miles, was 14:42.

## Beer Drinkers Seek Champion

MADRID (AP)—Top Spanish beer drinkers are "fighting" for the right to represent Spain in the European beer drinking championship this summer.

The Spanish contest is organized by the recently constituted National Federation of Beer Drinkers. The federation, which already has 5,000 members, is also the organizer of the European championship to be held in Madrid. Countries invited are Germany, England, Italy, Belgium and Switzerland.

Every foreign competitor will compete with the beer of his own country. The Spanish record is 7.9 quarts drunk in an hour in a tourney in Barcelona last year.

## TWO SCHOOLS CLOSED

BANGKOK, Thailand (AP)—The Thailand government has closed two Chinese schools in the kingdom, one for propagating Communism, the other for violating teaching regulations.

## Firemen Hear Proposal to Alter Pension

Propositions for an improved pension plan were aired and discussed Friday night at city hall by a board of Salem fire department officers with the fire department personnel.

Results of Friday's discussion will be reviewed with actuaries in Salem and the feasibility of these suggestions formed into a measure possibly in time for the fall election.

Inadequacies of the present system were explained Friday by assistant fire chief Ellsworth Smith along with a few of the propositions.

"Changes by the Salem department are not directed toward asking for any increase in the city

levy for this pension," Smith said. "Rather, we are hoping to facilitate a simplified means of increasing the personnel payment into one fund for retirement."

The present pension program is realized from the ultimate combination of four separate funds, principally (1) service retirement; (2) death after service retirement; (3) disability retirement, and (4) death before service retirement.

Certain provisions in the retirement plan require that a man work 30 years for retirement or until he reaches the age of 62 years along with percentage levies for a wife and family. Some men who have no families are thus deprived of justifiable consideration in this obligatory levy.

## DEVELOP INDUSTRIAL POWER

TOKYO (AP)—Japanese power companies expect to spend 255 million dollars this year in developing new hydroelectric and coal power plants to meet increasing demands. The National Public Utility Commission said present capacity of 9 million kilowatts will be increased by 1,287,000 kilowatts.
