### R. E. Shattuck Succumbs to Short Illness

Robert E. Shattuck, former owner of the Oregon Auto Wrecking Co., on North Commercial Street, died in a local hospital Friday night after a short illness. Shattuck retired from his business, located at 960 N. Commercial St., three years ago, when he lost his eyesight. His home was 1337 N. Winter St. He had operated the business, formerly known as the 930 Auto Wrecking Co., for 14 years, after coming here from Nebraska.

He was born in Roseland, Neb., Nov. 1, 1897, and spent most of his early life in that area. He was married there in 1927 to Mrs. Irene Shattuck, who survives him. He was a member of both the Eagles and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Besides the widow, he is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Rosemary Selmer of Philomath, sons, Eugene of Washington State, Walter of Newport, James of Portland, George of Pasco, Wash.; sisters, Mrs. Tillie Overfield of Salem and Mrs. Ruth Overfield of Silverton; brother, Ben Shattuck of Bremerton, Wash.; and 12 grandchildren.

Services will be held at 3 p.m. Tuesday in the Clough-Barrick Chapel, with the Rev. George H. Swift officiating. Interment will be in Belcrest Memorial Park.
