### Watch Techniques In Curtain Washes

Here's a tip about curtain-washing: Don't over-stretch when drying. Cotton, rayon or other marquisette curtains can be dried on frames, but you shouldn't try to get them back to their original size. Experts suggest that when you buy curtains of these fabrics you allow for considerable shrinkage. Nylon, orlon and spun glass curtains need not be put on frames. They do not shrink.

When washing very sheer type curtains, put them in mesh bags if you're using a washing machine and use plenty of lukewarm water and a good detergent, running the machine only a few minutes.

### Restaurant Dish Made at Home Too

Fried shrimp is a favorite with restaurant patrons, is extremely appetizing when made the right way because of its crisp, golden appearance, and yet can easily be prepared in the home kitchen.

**FRIED SHRIMP**  
 1/4 cup sifted enriched flour  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 1 egg, grade A, B or C  
 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice  
 1/2 cup milk  
 Shortening or lard for deep frying  
 2 dozen cleaned, cooked shrimp

Sift together the flour and salt. Beat the egg; add the milk and lemon juice and beat into the flour until the mixture is smooth. Meantime heat fat to the depth of 2 inches until it will brown an inch cube of bread in 1 minute (350° F.). Dip the shrimp, one by one, into the batter and then slide

### Detergent Date Answers Queries

The many new types of detergents for laundering clothes have brought queries from housewives as to their best use and the possible effect on wear, shrinkage or color of fabrics.

From a recent study of laundering women's work dresses made from yellow cotton broadcloth, the Kansas Experiment Station reports:

1. The amount of synthetic detergent needed for home laundering was about half the amount of other detergents required for cleanliness. The soaps used in the test were pure neutral soap flakes, bar laundry soap, and granule soap.
2. No one type of detergent or method of laundering caused more shrinkage of fabric than any other.
3. The dresses that were subjected to overlong washing showed a loss in weight — an indication that subjecting fabric to too much friction in washing may cause wear.
4. The length of time fabric is washed appeared to have more effect on loss of color than the detergent used. Generally, the commercial laundering process is longer than home laundering in an automatic washer, and this may be

### Hamburger in Casserole Special

The possibilities of using ground beef in recipes seems limitless. Many of the recipes are similar, but there's lots of variety nevertheless. Here is one, the tomato gives it a name.

**OLD SANTA FE HAMBURGER**  
 4 ounces elbow macaroni  
 2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
 1/2 pound ground beef  
 1 small onion, chopped  
 1 small clove garlic, chopped  
 1/2 teaspoon salt  
 Dash pepper  
 1 1/4 cups condensed tomato soup  
 1 cup cooked green beans  
 Cook macaroni in boiling salted water until tender (about 10 minutes). Drain and rinse. While macaroni is cooking, melt butter or margarine in skillet. Add ground beef, onion and garlic and brown lightly. Season with salt and pep-

per. Add tomato soup, green beans and macaroni and blend well. Bake in 1-quart casserole in moderate oven (350°) about 20 minutes. Makes 4 servings.

### LUNCHEON'S DELIGHT

Tuna salad sandwiches have long been the favorite of working girls. We give them a new and different look by adding chopped ripe olives to the regular salad ingredients. Then stuff the mixture into halved hot dog buns. Serve whole olives for garnish.

### NEW QUIRK

Instead of hollowing out the tomatoes for a stuffed salad, we've found it is much simpler to cut them almost through into six wedges and spread the sections apart. Place on a garnished salad plate and fill with a salad mixture of chopped hard-cooked eggs, wedges of ripe olives, sliced celery and mayonnaise with a bit of mustard and lemon juice added to the dressing.

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
