

Pearce Hurls 1-Hitter in Legion Win

New Softball Field Dedicated Tonight

The new and long-needed softball arena for Salem, to be known officially as "Phillips Field", will be dedicated tonight starting at six o'clock. The field is located in the southeast corner of Bush Pasture.

Mayor Al Loucks will open the dedication ceremonies by reading a proclamation issued by the Salem city council, giving the field its name. The field is named

after the late Paul L. Phillips, prominent Salem fireman who died as a result of a heart attack last July.

Captain Phillips succumbed after a softball game. He was manager of the local fire ladders team and was a sports enthusiast for many years.

Fire Chief William Robie, Mrs. Phillips and a son, Jack, will take part in the ceremonies. An exhibition game between the

Fire Department and the Salem Teamsters will follow the short program.

Local sportscaster Gene Goode is to be master of ceremonies and Salem firemen, all in uniform, will present a \$500 check to Mayor Loucks for the field lighting fund.

It is hoped that softball games in the new park will be played under lights before the current season is ended.

Pearce had a no-hitter with one out in the final frame. Then Ron Schmidt, Mt. Angel first sacker, blooped a little Texas Leaguer to ruin the bid.

In downing the Mt. Angel team the Salems posted their fifth straight victory and copped the first half pennant in the district derby.

Coach Vince Genna's gang biffed nine hits off Jim Wellman of the visitors and it was another Schmidt, this one Shortstop Chet of the C-P's, who got three of the blows. Catcher Wayne Osborn got two.

Osborn's single, Twink Pederson's double, an outfield fly by Larry Springer and Schmidt's single scored two Salems runs in the third. Gregg's single, a walk, a single by Pearce and an error brought in the other C-P tally in the fourth.

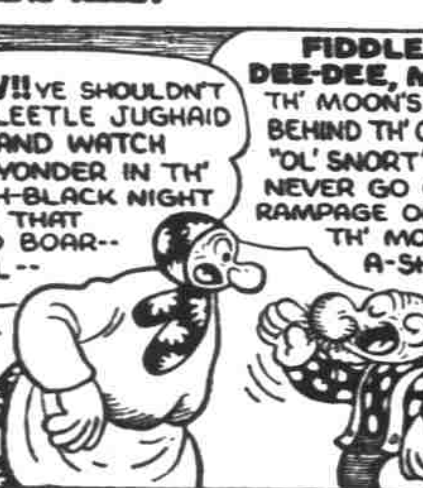
