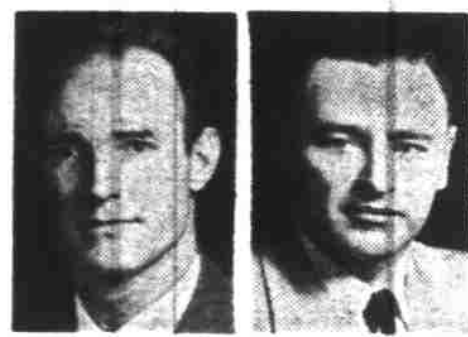


Bakery Firm Promotes 2 Men in Salem

Waxy Gordon, Ex-Underworld King, Succumbs

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Irving F. Wexler, alias Waxy Gordon, one of the last of the underworld kings of the prohibition era, died Tuesday afternoon in the prison hospital at Alcatraz.

The Alcatraz warden's office announced the passing of the former New York "beer baron" with the terse words:

"Irving Wexler died at 5 p.m. (PDT) Tuesday. Clinical cause of death is undetermined."

Unofficial sources said Gordon had been chatting with one of the prison hospital staff when he was stricken with a "massive heart attack."

SALE PROTEST

LONDON (INS)—British merchant navy officers have strongly protested against the sale of too many British ships to foreign nations. Their spokesman is D. S. Tennant, secretary of the Navigators and Engineers Officers Union, who said that old ships sold abroad may help foreign competitors to capture British shipping contracts.

Pet Day Set Friday at City Playgrounds

Prizes will be awarded Friday to children on Salem playgrounds who have the largest, smallest, prettiest, most unusual, best trained pet or the pet with the largest family, on the traditional Pet Day.

In the first two weeks of the recreational program, almost 200 youngsters more than last year's count for the same period have been using the parks and swimming pools. Figures are tabulated on a group participation rather than an individual count. Swimming pools are open to children over four years and all activity is free and under supervision.

According to Vernon Gilmore, recreation director, participation is expected to increase with the warm weather.

Attending the Olinger pool in the first two weeks were some 3,538 youngsters; in other activities, 1,216; at Leslie pool, 1,769; other activities, 361.

Bush's Pasture had 941 youngsters; Echo, 2,292; Grant School, 687; Highland School, 762; Richmond School, 401; West Salem Park, 729; Washington School, 379; McKinley School, 1,459. Musical activities counted 285 attendants.

There is instruction in various handicrafts and sports in the program. Special days beside the Pet Day include the "Learn to Swim Campaign, July 7 to 18; Doll Day, July 11; Dress Up Day, July 25; Parade Day, Aug. 8; Hobby Horse Day, Aug. 22; Closing picnics, Aug. 29.

Revised State Pay Schedule Nearly Ready

State Civil Service Commission officials indicated Tuesday that a revised salary schedule for state workers, to replace the one disapproved recently by Gov. Douglas McKay, would be ready for presentation to the State Emergency Board within a week or 10 days.

The governor, in disapproving the commission's previous pay increase schedule, said it was too broad and the state was without funds to cover all state employees included. McKay asked a revision of the schedule confined to only such employees as are in demand under existing conditions.

Part of the money required for the revised pay schedule probably will have to be allocated from the state emergency fund which now totals approximately \$850,000. Other funds may be provided by state departments which have a surplus on hand.

State Finance Department Director Harry Dorman said he would call a special meeting of the State Emergency Board as soon as the revised pay schedule is ready for discussion.

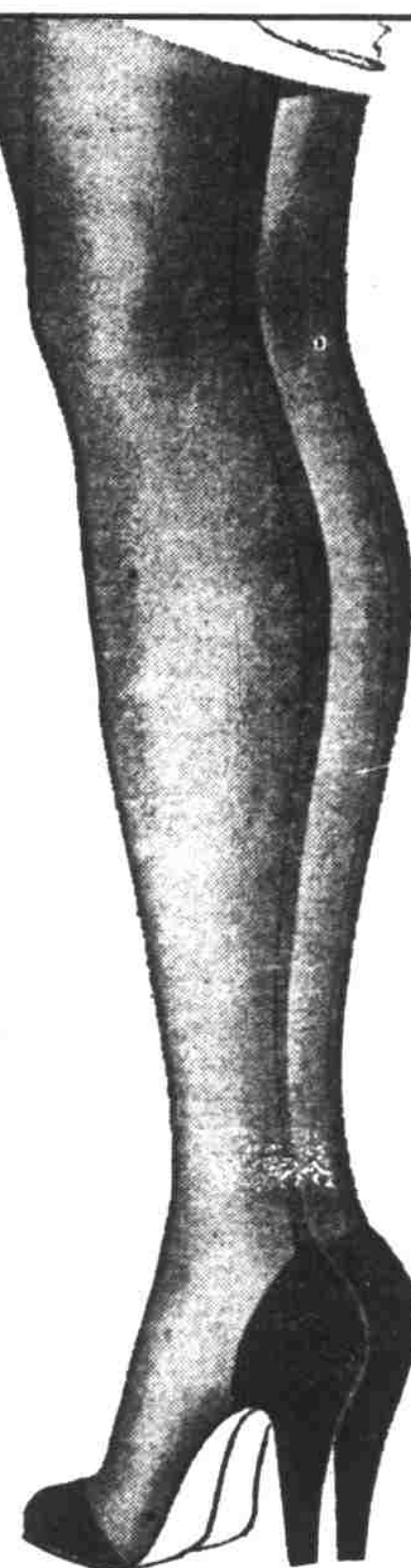
