

### Military Planners Criticized for Not Pressing Uranium Search

WASHINGTON (AP)—A congressional committee Sunday criticized military planners for what it termed a failure to press for discovery and production of uranium, the basic raw material of atomic bombs. In a report to Congress, the Senate-House Atomic Energy Committee declared: "Just as iron or copper or gold or virtually any other raw material may be produced in greater quantities, given time and given a willingness to pay the necessary cost, so uranium may also be produced in greater quantities, likewise given time and given a willingness to pay the necessary cost. . . .

### Eskimos Plan Thanksgiving Fete in Arctic

FORT McPHERSON, N.W.T. (AP)—The Anglican mission at this Arctic settlement will look like a raw-fur trading post Saturday when residents hold their Thanksgiving services, four months ahead of time.

Along with dollar bills and coins the collection plates will be piled high with muskrat skins—the Eskimos' way of saying "Thank You" to God for a bountiful harvest. The official trapping season in the McKenzie River delta ends June 15.

At St. Matthew's Mission in Ft. McPherson, 1,200 miles northwest of Edmonton, the services are held in English and in the tongue of the Loucheux Indians. The traditional Eskimo custom is also carried out in Aklavik, where Eskimos, Loucheux Indians and white trappers take part, each in their own language.

The practice dates back to 1861-62 when Rev. W. Kirby first preached the Gospel to the Eskimos and Indians. Those were the days when cash was scarce and animal hides and furs were used as the medium of exchange, particularly the pelt of the white fox.

In each of the prayer books of the Western Arctic Eskimo, the Loucheux and the white Anglicans a selection is set forth giving

thanks to God for his blessings received in hunting and trapping. The collection varies from year to year, but usually one-third to one-half of the offering is in muskrat pelts. The value of the pelts, ranging from \$1 to \$3 each, depends on current prices. Last year 80 skins were collected in addition to the cash offering.

All of the 400 residents of Fort McPherson take part in the ceremony. In some quarters, the event is referred to as "Rat Sunday," but the mission priest, Rev. E. P. A. Timmons, says the church prefers the term "Thanksgiving Sunday."

### Commie Shell Lands Near Truce Tent

MUNSAN, Korea (AP)—The Allies told the Communists Sunday that a shell which landed near the Panmunjom conference tent bore the mark of a Soviet-made anti-aircraft gun.

The U.N. protest was handed to the Red liaison-officer on the second day of the three-day recess which Allied Maj. Gen. William

K. Harrison invoked Saturday by walking out on the angry Red truce delegation.

The projectile landed in the Panmunjom neutral zone about 6 a.m. Friday but caused no damage.

The Peiping Radio charged that the Allied-imposed recess, the bombing of the hydro-electric stations and the new screening of Communist prisoners "all were directed at undermining the armistice talks, expanding the war and threatening peace in Asia and the world."

The broadcast, heard in San Francisco by the Associated Press, referred to the power stations as "non-military targets."
