Deadline for Petitions Near

Deadline for filing completed petitions for initiative measures for the November election expires at 5 p.m. Thursday, David O'Hara, in charge of the state elections bureau, warned here Sunday.

Taft's Views on South America Bring Rebuke

LIMA, Peru (AP)—Nelson Rockefeller told the newspaper El Comercio in an interview Sunday that Sen. Taft's views on aid to South America do not reflect the views of the American people.

The former assistant secretary of state for Latin American affairs was pouring oil on the waters churned up here by a speech Taft made last Friday at Charlottesville, Va.

Taft said he couldn't see how Latin America could help the U. S. in its "anti-Soviet operation" and "I've always thought arms to South America would only foment more revolutions in South America itself."

Rockefeller told the newspaper "I hope it (the statement) results from some misunderstanding because this viewpoint does not reflect the sentiments of the North American people who realize their future depends on international and inter-American cooperation."
