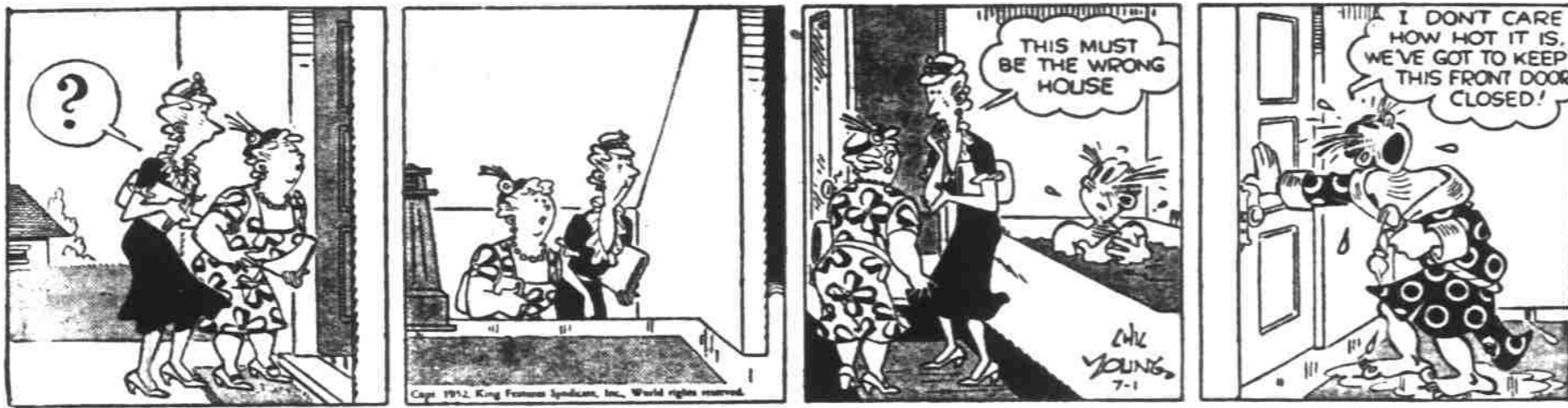

HAMILTON, Ont. (P)—Jack Hutchins and Doug Clement, University of Oregon athletes, will be on the Canadian Olympic team. A selection committee named Hutchins for the 800-meter run and Clement for the 400-meter run and 1,600-meter relay.

Hutchins was graduated from Oregon this spring. He is the first University of Oregon athlete to appear in two Olympic games. He also represented Canada in 1948. Clement was a freshman.

Hutchins will run in the 800-meter, and Clement will perform in the 400-meter run and the 1,600-meter relay.

## Germans Best Track Record

BERLIN (P)—German athletes tied the 1,500 meters world record and matched or beat several Olympic marks Sunday to establish themselves as contenders at Helsinki in their first summer Olympic appearance since 1936.

Werner Lueg, a 20-year-old surprise, turned in the feature performance of the Olympic qualification trials by equalling the world record for 1,500 meters with a time of 7 minutes 43 seconds.

In the two-day qualifying meet, Germans also beat Olympic records in three other events—the hammer throw, 3,000 meter steeplechase, and women's shotput—and tied the Olympic record in the women's 80 meter hurdles.

## Dutch Woman Enters Games

AMSTERDAM (P)—Fanny Blankers-Koen, flying Dutch housewife who again is Holland's best hope for Olympic gold medals, will enter four events at Helsinki—the 100-meter dash, 200-meter dash, 80-meter hurdles and 400-meter relay.

In Sunday's national championships, she set a world record for 100 meters in 11.4 seconds, one tenth of a second faster than the record she shared with Helen Stephens (USA) of 11.5 seconds.

In the 200-meter dash she established a Dutch record of 23.7 seconds and equalled her own world record of 11 seconds for the 80-meter hurdles.
