

Morgan Re-elected By Oregon Demos

PORTLAND (AP)—Howard Morgan, Monmouth, Saturday was re-elected state chairman by Oregon Democrats.

This time he was unopposed for the post which he won last winter by a single vote margin over State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson.

Two other candidates for top offices in the organization were unopposed. They are Volney Martin, Portland, secretary, and Dexter Fairbank, Portland, treasurer.

Mrs. Gladys Last, Portland, was re-elected vice chairman by a 31-26 margin over Mrs. Margaret Cawood, Portland.

George Sheridan, chairman of the Pierce County, Wash., central committee, urged the Oregon delegation to the Democratic convention at Chicago to support Sen. Warren G. Magnuson of Washington for the vice presidential nomination.

Monroe Sweetland, Oregon's Democratic national committeeman, seemed to rebuff the suggestion when he said: "Because of a variety of commitments, the Western States are unable to get together on candidates but we all can get together on issues common to us all—power, reclamation, and the admission of Alaska and Hawaii as states."

Sweetland, a member of the Oregon delegation, said Oregon votes are pledged to Sen. Estes Kefauver of Tennessee, not only for president, but for vice president, should he fail to get the top nomination.

Morgan described instances of

what he said was mishandling of state jobs and facilities. He said such reports will be used by Democrats to gain the posts of state treasurer and secretary of state in the coming election.

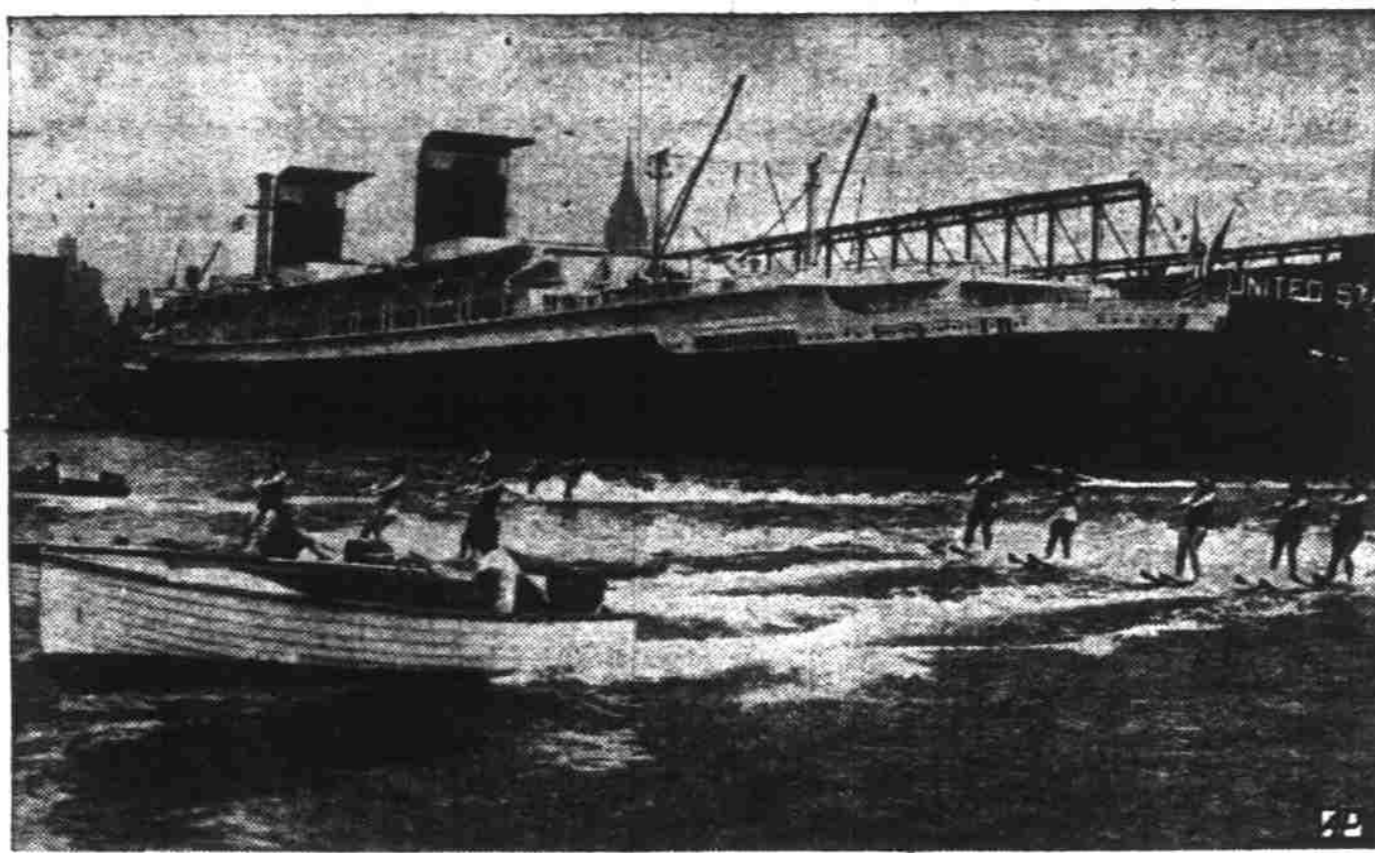

County Needs Sky-Watch Volunteers

Only 10 of a hoped-for 84 persons will be available when Marion County begins the rest of the nation Monday morning in a round-the-clock watch.

Eugene McIntire, who is supervising the enlistment of personnel, said the 10 Marion County posts will be only partially manned throughout the week, with no post having enough personnel for full 24-hours duty.

He said the sky-watch will require 84 persons, each serving four hour watches during the week.

"We'll man posts beginning Monday morning and keep them manned until we run out of people," McIntire said, "and then we'll have to quit." Not all the 10 persons now available can work Monday. They have signed up for various times during the week, McIntire said.

Veteran Collects Indian Weapons

PASADENA, Calif. (AP)—Capt. A. G. Sylvester, a veteran of the Spanish-American War, started collecting Indian instruments of war, early firearms and other relics during his boyhood in Illinois.

He says he was reared on Indian lore by his uncles. One was a partner of Buffalo Bill Cody and another fought with Gen. Custer.

Capt. Sylvester says his Indian pottery has been described as the oldest ever exhibited at the Southwest Museum. Many of his Indian weapons were found on San Miguel Island, off the Southern California coast.

Pilot Writes Apology Note In Death Watch

FAIRBANKS, Alaska (AP)—An Air Force captain who lived seven days after his plane crashed in the Yukon Valley last Jan. 12, painfully scribbled a note of farewell to his wife and an apology to his commanding officer.

He was Capt. Harvey Tilton, 35, of Sacramento, Calif. Four other members of the plane's crew perished in the crashup. The wreckage was found Tuesday about 150 miles north of here.

Tenth Rescue Squadron ground crewmen who reached the small parachute shelter close to the plane found the body of Captain Tilton nearby.

He had scribbled seven marks on a message indicating that he had been alive seven days after the crash.

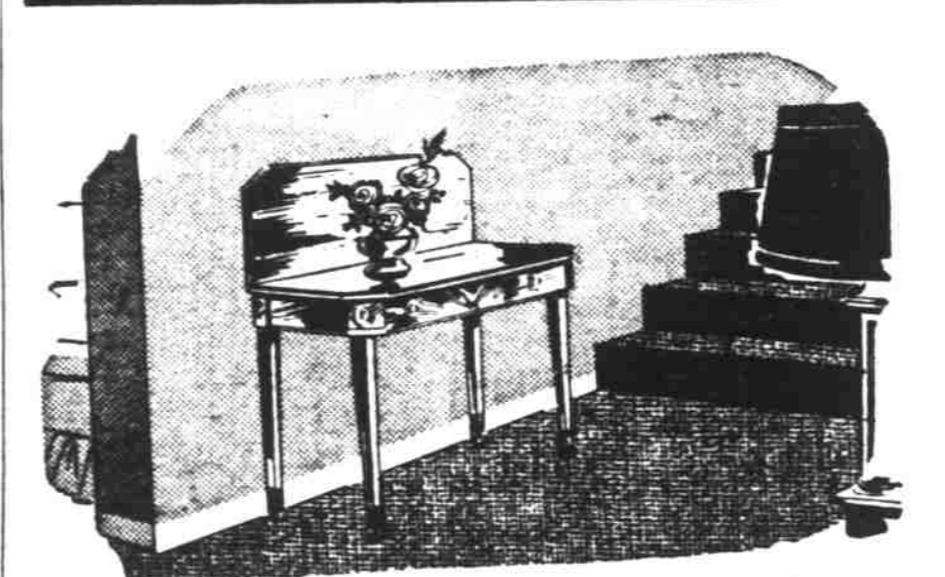
Also found was a message to his wife but Air Force officials refused to disclose its text until it is delivered to Mrs. Tilton.

Another message addressed to Col. Edward Moore, who was commanding officer of Eielson Air Force Base where the plane and crew was based, said:

"I am sorry, Colonel."
It apparently was a pilot's apology for losing his plane and crew.

Singapore Limits Japan Textiles

SINGAPORE (AP)—The Singapore government has fixed a maximum quota of \$100,000,000 worth of textiles from Japan for importation by colony merchants, it has been officially announced.

The Deputy Secretary for Economic Affairs, T. van der Gaast, said the government had reached agreement on the quota issue after weeks of discussion with the three chambers of commerce — Singapore (European), Chinese and Indian.

Last year Malaya imported \$157,000,000 worth of Japanese textiles.
