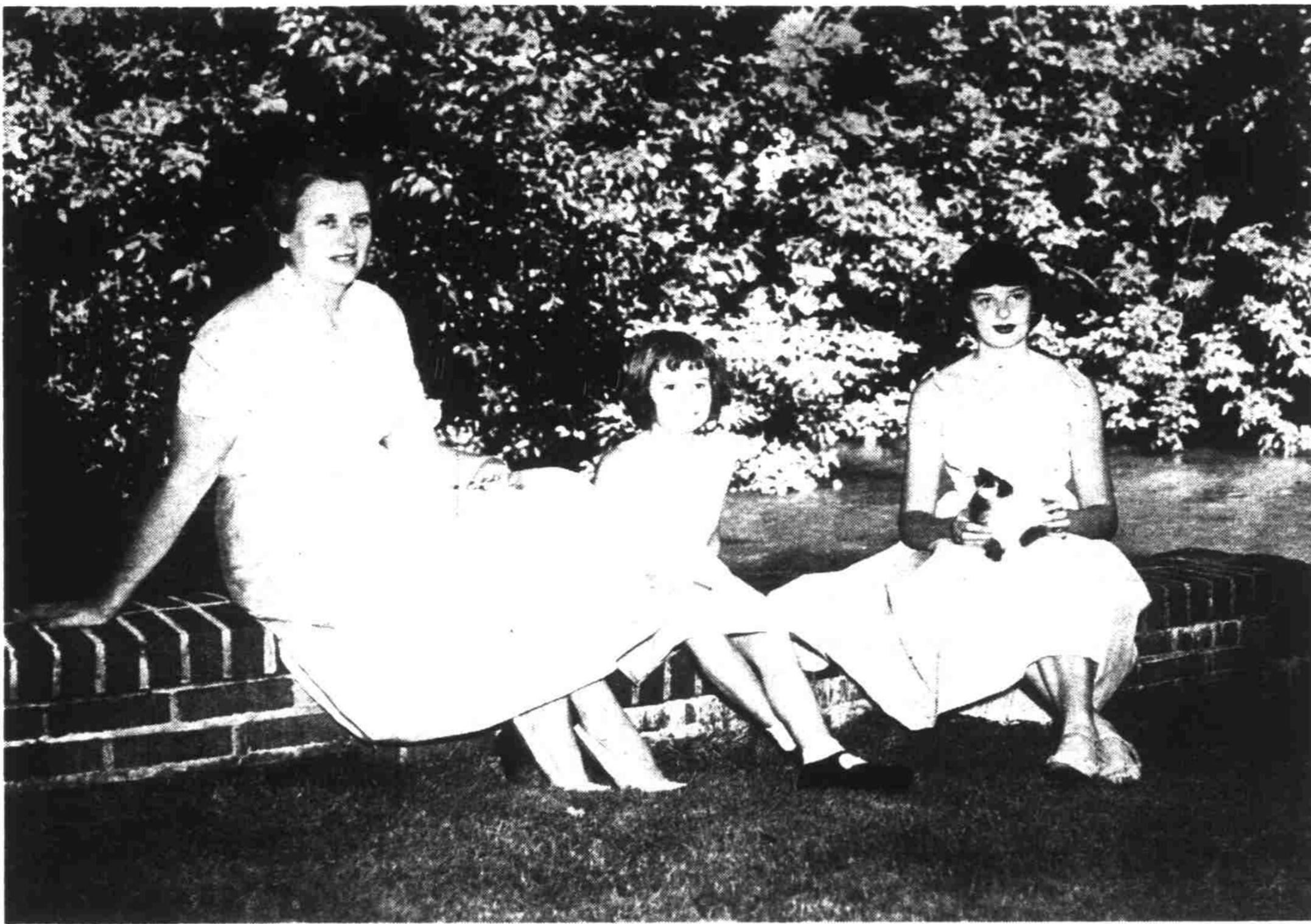

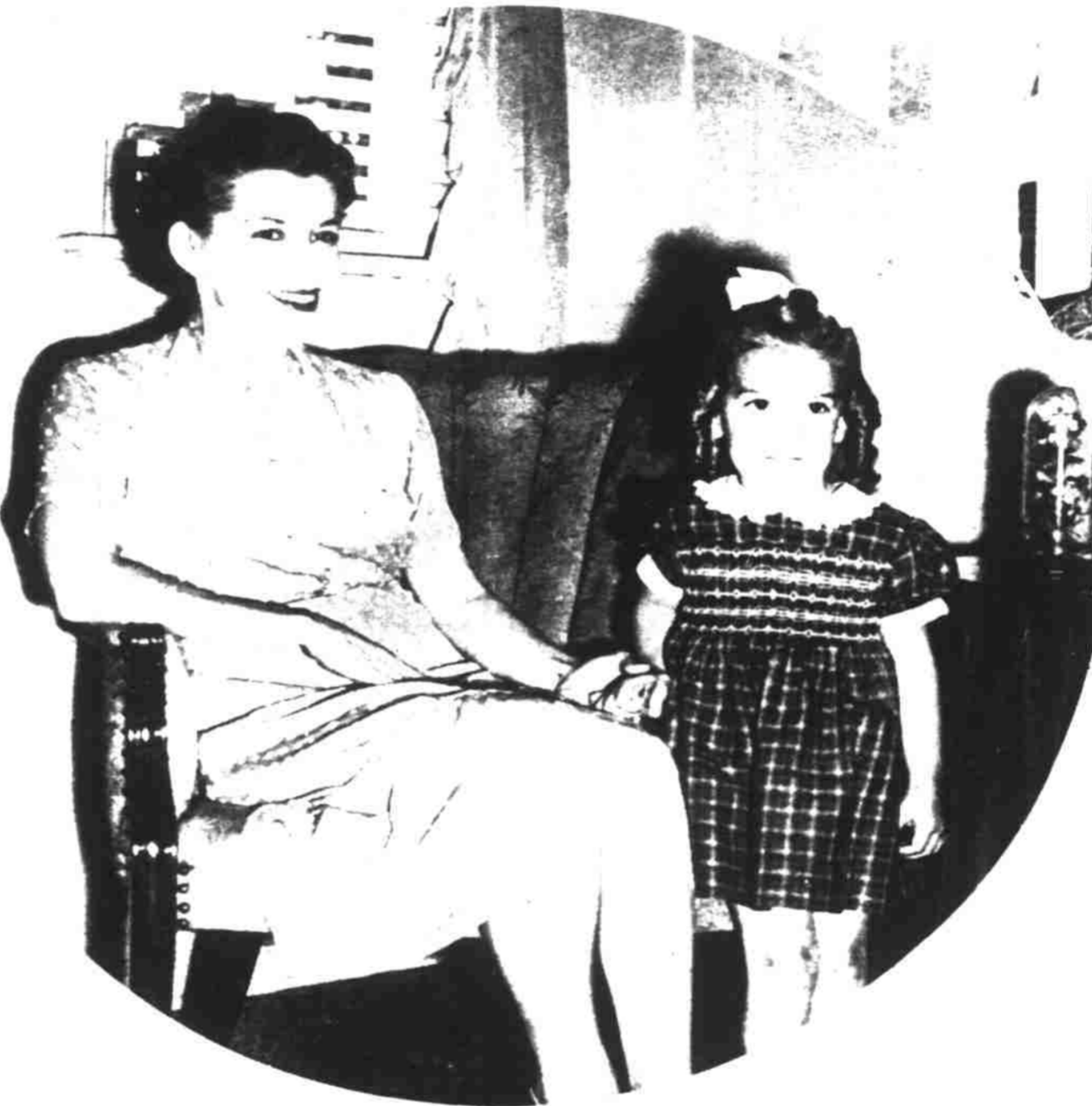
CAKES AT HOME PLATE
