Singapore War Debt Settled

SINGAPORE (AP)—The Singapore government has agreed to square a long standing account with Ceylon started when the Ceylon government rendered cash assistance to Malaysians who were evacuated there during the Japanese attack on Malaya.

Total Ceylon government assistance to Singapore citizens amount-

ed to \$695. Over the past two years, the colony had tried to recover the debts from the individuals concerned, but was able to collect only \$51. The colony Legislative Council has therefore agreed to provide the funds to pay off the debt.

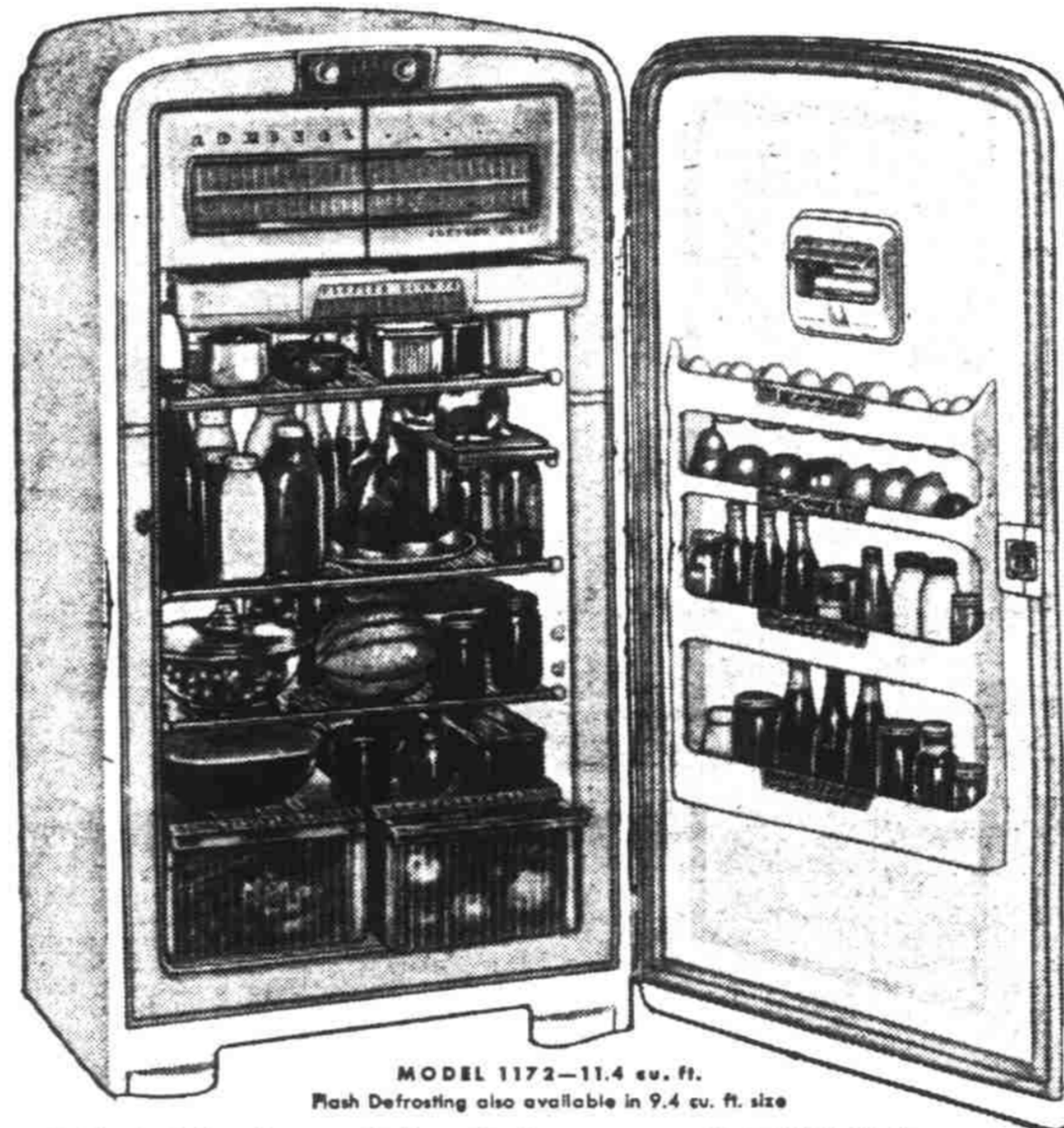
