Two-Day Tour Of Willamette Basin Slated

A two-day inspection tour of the Willamette Basin is to begin Wednesday in Eugene for all mid-valley county agents. The tour is sponsored by the Salem Chamber of Commerce Agriculture Committee.

The trip is intended to be a tour of "familiarization as well as entertainment," Benjamin Newell, Marion County agent, explained. The agents will be shown the progress brought about in the construction of several dams on the Willamette River.

George West of the Corps of Engineers will lead the group out of Eugene Wednesday morning to the Cottage Grove and Lake Dorena Dams. They will stop at Lookout Point Dam, the Meridian site above Lowell, and will be shown the project by C. C. Davis, resident engineer there.

A stop at Oakridge Fish Hatchery will be followed by a trip to Salem for a no-host dinner at the Senator Hotel. Gov. Douglas McKay, Salem Mayor Alfred Loucks and Dr. A. L. Strand, president of Oregon State College, will welcome the agents to Salem.

Thursday morning the agents are to go from Salem to see Detroit Dam. Luncheon will be at the Marion Forks Fish Hatchery and then the group will tour back across the future lake behind Detroit Dam for a study of possible recreation facilities and irrigation prospects.

This tour is confined to county agents but an open house at the Detroit Dam is planned sometime in September to which the public will be invited, Newell reported.

Sears Plane Here Tuesday With Officials

A Sears, Roebuck and Company plane, bearing members of the Sears board of directors on an inspection trip is scheduled to arrive at Salem at 10:10 a.m., Tuesday from San Francisco.

Aboard the plane, a Beechcraft, will be G. B. Hattersley, vice president of Sears in charge of its Eastern territory, Philadelphia; C. H. Kellstedt, vice president in charge of Sears' Southern territory, Atlanta, and Crowds Baker, treasurer of the company.

The directors will be met at the airport by J. F. Mosolf, Salem manager, and members of his staff who will take the directors to lunch at the Sears store.

Mosolf said Saturday that purchases by Sears of merchandise manufactured in the Pacific Northwest had increased in 25 years to the total of more than \$117,000,000, spent last year for products bought from 342 manufacturers in 40 different cities.

Reserves Set Departure for Camp Today

Departure for summer training at Fort Lewis, Wash., this morning for 85 Army Reserve men does not necessarily mean that all men connected with 929th Field Artillery Battalion and the 413th Infantry Regiment will be going.

The men who are travelling with the two groups, both of the famous 104th (Timberwolf) Infantry Division, will leave some of their number behind. Permission to remain here may be gained by a man if the trip will bring about "extreme hardship." Examples of such hardship may be illness in the family, possible loss of a job or an accident to the reservist.

One man, who is making the trip, feels he shouldn't be. He reports he's been trying to sell his house for some time and just yesterday the sale was completed. The new buyer requested occupancy in one week which will leave his wife to find a home and move their belongings into it.

Another man, M. Sgt. J. H. De Moully, will have to gain permission to return to Salem Monday as he is to meet with a legislative committee to discuss law indexing on which he has been working. Presumably he will have to fly

both ways as he'll be due back in camp Monday evening.

Still another member of the Reserves is being drafted into the Army. He has been allowed to remain at home until his departure for camp as a draftee.

Commander of the 929th is Lt. Col. Roy C. Edgerton, 1067 Edgewater St., and 1st Lt. F. P. Larson, 1730 S. Summer St., heads the 413th.

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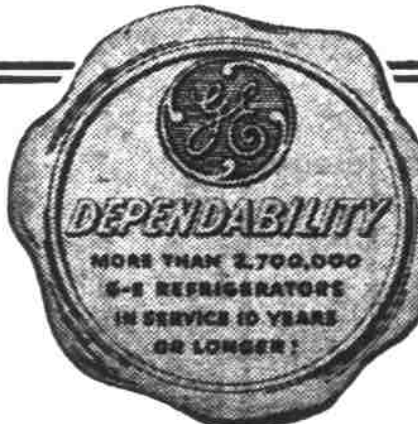
