Courthouse Excavation to Start in August

The old courthouse will be no more than a jumble of rubble after this week, according to plans of Cleveland Wrecking Co. If work proceeds as expected, excavation for the new building will begin the week of Aug. 10.

Richard Laws, superintendent for the wreckers of Marion County Courthouse, said the jail will be cut out of the basement this week, then a tractor and cable will pull out floor supports to crumple what remains of the three lower floors. The rest of the firm's task will be disposing of the materials.

E. R. Viesko of Viesko and Post, Salem firm which has the general contract for the new structure, said excavation will commence as soon as the ground is cleared, with the schedule calling for completion of footings and much of the basement work before the fall rains start.

Viesko said the continuing strike has clouded the picture for steel for the building, but that the firm has commitments assuring structural and reinforcing steel for a good start on the project.

The contractor also announced yesterday award of a sub-contract for two elevators for the courthouse to Western Electric, at a cost of \$39,000. Both will be automatic and travel at high speed. One will carry the public and the other will take prisoners between the jail and courthouses. Installation will start next spring.

Funeral services for Jack Lindland Larsen, 25, crop dusting pilot who was killed in a plane crash early Saturday morning, will be held Tuesday, July 22 at 2:30 p.m. in the chapel of the W. T. Rigdon Co.

Larsen was dusting the John Grenz bean fields Saturday when his plane ran into a 12,000-volt line and crashed. Observers pulled Larsen out of the crash but he died within 15 minutes after being rescued.

Born in Bowbell, N.D., Larsen moved with his parents to Salem at an early age and attended Salem schools. He entered Willamett University in 1950 for two semesters.

Larsen had trained under the G. I. Bill with the Ace Flying Service of Salem before taking the job as a duster for the Farm-Air Corporation.

Survivors include his mother, Mrs. Doris Larsen of Salem; father, Omar Larsen of Reedsport and a brother, Larry of Vallejo, Calif.
