

Civil Rights Compromise In Platform

CHICAGO (AP)—The Democrats adopted early Thursday a campaign platform keyed to promises of "peace with honor," prosperity and progress.

By and large, the 6,000-word document is an endorsement of and pledge to continue the foreign and domestic programs of the Truman administration.

The "civil rights" plank as adopted represented a compromise of the thorny issue that long has split Northern and Southern wings of the party. Neither side was entirely satisfied with it, though each decided it was acceptable.

The platform was adopted by voice vote. There was a sizable volume of "noes" shouted but Chairman Sam Rayburn declared the "ayes" had it.

The Georgia and Mississippi delegations asked to be recorded as voting "no."

The averting of a knock-down, drag-out floor fight over civil rights was a major accomplishment of the harmony campaign being pressed by old line party leaders.

Four years ago there was a floor battle that led to Southerners putting a States' Rights ticket into the campaign.

8-Hour Session
The compromise plank was the main subject of a final eight-hour session of the 108-member platform committee which produced the document.

Sen. Warren G. Magnuson of Washington took credit for a compromise suggestion which largely resulted in composing Northern and Southern differences over the civil rights plank.

This, he said, was to suggest that "we favor enforceable legislation" on civil rights be changed to "we favor federal legislation effectively to secure these rights."

The word "enforceable" was "like a red flag" to the Southerners, Magnuson said.

"I think we've got the campaign half won," he declared. "When you get senators as far apart as Herbert Lehman and Seward Hotland to go along, it's really something."

Atomic Reference
The platform itself began with a reference to the atomic era and the challenge of survival to government leaders.

Then it pointed proudly to 20 years of Democratic administrations under Presidents Franklin Roosevelt and Truman, saying:

"Our country has moved steadily along the road which has led the United States of America to world leadership in the cause of freedom."

"We will not retreat one inch along that road."

In a bid for continued voter support the platform said the "democratic Party has been the chosen instrument to achieve prosperity, build a stronger democracy, erect the structure of world peace, and continue on the path of progress."

Democratic Party policies and programs were credited with aiding business, agriculture, labor and other major segments of the population.

Peace with Honor
On foreign policy, the platform declared "peace with honor is the greatest of all our goals."

Then it pledged continuance of the programs of collective security, full support for the United Nations, and "strong, balanced defense forces" which it described as the best way to avert the "frightful agony" of another world war.

The platform, in reviewing the Democratic Party's record of the past 20 years, said it had achieved prosperity, built a stronger democracy, and erected a strong world peace.

It stressed particularly New Deal and "Fair Deal" programs designed to aid labor and agriculture.

The draft document pledged the party to repeal of the Taft-Hartley Labor Act — legislation which President Truman has declared to be unfair to workers.

CHICAGO (AP)—Alben W. Barkley, speaking "from my heart," told Democratic Convention delegates Wednesday night their party will win the election if it can get "the truth" across to the American people.

The 4-year-old vice president got a roaring, 24-minute demonstration when he came before the convention in the role of a party rallier and harmonizer.

Some in the galleries chanted "we want Barkley" and "Barkley For President" banners appeared on the convention floor.

But Barkley told the delegates he would not have come before them if he had not stepped out of the presidential race.

"I know the proprietors," he said.

From there he swung into an old-fashioned, rousing political speech of the kind for which he has long been famous.

CHICAGO (AP) — Gov. Paul A. Dever of Massachusetts, temporary chairman for the Democratic National Convention, has received over 200 telegrams suggesting cures for his sore throat, CBS-TV reported Wednesday.

The Democrats favor reduction of levies "as rapidly as defense requirements permit," especially for lower income groups.

The platform declared strong opposition to proposals that the federal government get less revenue from incomes and more from taxes on sales.

It favored "sound, progressive" development of the nation's land and water resources for flood control, navigation, irrigation, power drainage, soil conservation, and creation of new, small family-sized farms.

CHICAGO (AP)—Fulvous, a daughter of Dixiana Stable's famed Spy Song, won the 24th running of the \$68,175 Lassie Stakes at Arlington Park Wednesday.

The winner was ridden by Jockey Steve Brooks, who guided Fulvous to a length triumph before 18,269 fans to win \$53,275, richest pot for two-year-old juvenile fillies in racing history.

Fulvous went to the post at 8 to 1 odds and returned \$19.60, \$10 and \$5.40. She sprinted the six furlongs in 1:13 4-5.
