Members of Chapter CB, FEO will meet for a family picnic on Thursday night at the Dallas City Park at 6 o'clock.

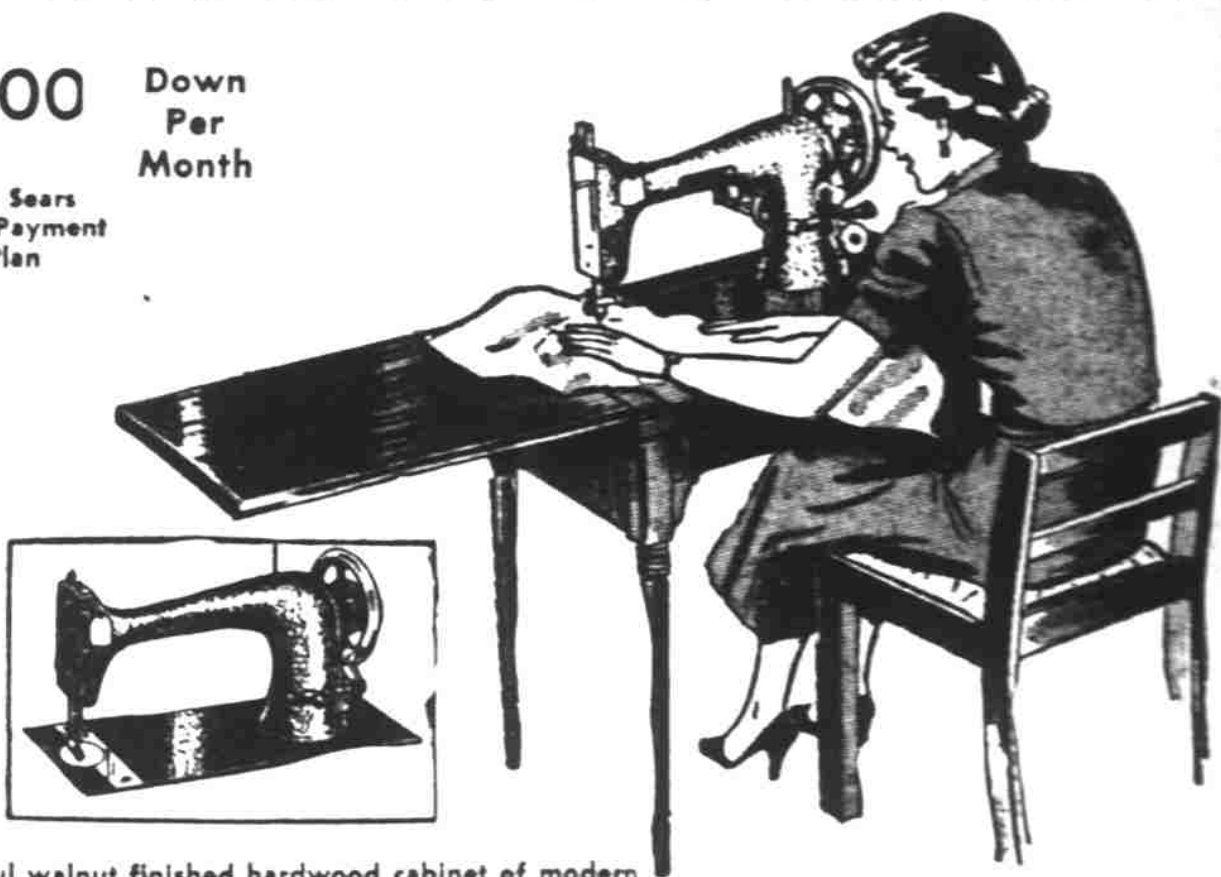
