

Yank Lead Cut; Bums Lose Again

Shantz Hurls 18th Victory

Bombers, Tiges Split; Tribe Climbs to 2nd

The major league pennant race shared the spotlight with little Bobby Shantz Sunday as the pinstriped left-hander of the Philadelphia Athletics hung up his 18th victory of an amazing season.
Shantz, the major's biggest winner, turned back the Chicago White Sox, 3-1, in the first game of a doubleheader. The A's made a clean sweep by grabbing the nightcap, 9-3.

Meanwhile, the New York Yankees ended their longest losing streak under manager Casey Stengel's four-year regime by splitting a doubleheader with tail-end Detroit. The Bombers snapped a five game losing streak by winning the second game, 6-0, after losing the opener, 8-3.

Boxing Slip
The split chopped the Yanks' lead to 3½ games. The Cleveland Indians ousted the Boston Red Sox from second place by taking two from Washington, 3-1 and 3-2, while the Red Sox divided with the St. Louis Browns, winning the second game, 9-3, after St. Louis had captured the first, 8-1.

In the National League, the St. Louis Cardinals edged Brooklyn, 4-3, but the Dodgers maintained their 4½ game bulge over the New York Giants, who suffered an 11-4 whipping at the hands of Cincinnati in the first game of a doubleheader. The second was rained out in the last of the third with the Reds leading, 1-0.

Phils Win Pair
The Philadelphia Phils took over fourth place from Chicago by downing the Cubs, 12-8 and 3-0. Boston clipped Pittsburgh, 5-2, in the first game of a twin bill and then battled the Pirates to a 3-3 11-inning tie.

Shantz permitted the White Sox only five hits, walked two and boosted his strikeout total to 103 by fanning four. The mighty mite, who has completed 19 out of 21 starts, squeezed home the A's final run in the ninth.
