The Salem Insurance Agents Association has invited the women's organization to attend its picnic on August 13 at Silver Falls Park.

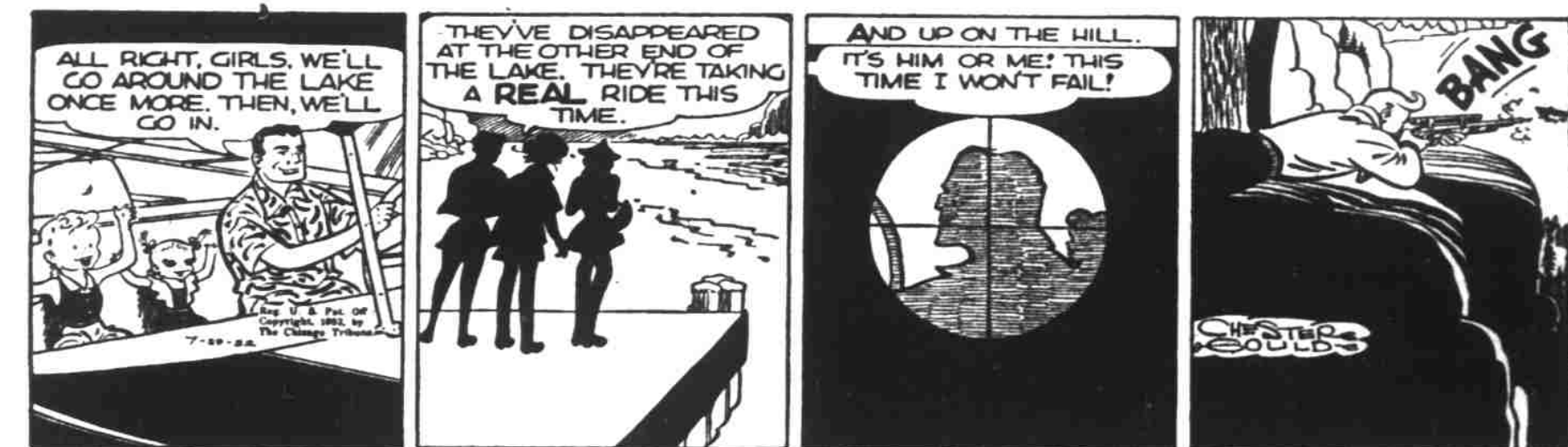
