

Kiser, Pederson Resume Mat Feud at Armory

The hottest wrestling feud in the Northwest — Jack Kiser vs. Eric Pederson — enters its third chapter at the Armory tonight as Matchmaker Elton Owen's weekly card. Jack the Tiger and Eric the Arrogant headlined the last two Tuesday nighters here also, and produced a pair of donnybrooks. In the first one Kiser cut up the chesty blond strong man con-

siderably and won the fierce brawl when the referee wouldn't allow the blood-dripping Pederson to continue. In the match of last week, with a different referee, the arbiter mistakenly ordered Kiser off a pin hold he had on Pederson in the final fall, and then allowed Pederson to apply a winning full nelson hold before Kiser recuperated sufficiently from breaking the previous hold. This maneuver came close to causing a riot, and the referee, a newcomer named Valentine, had to be escorted from the Armory premises for his own safety. Kiser demanded the "rubber" match tonight, with the veteran

Harry Elliott as referee. Harry definitely will third-man the scrap. And if Eric wants to play rough again, as he usually does, Kiser will make every effort to reopen the gash he put on Pederson's noggin two weeks ago. Tonight's semi-windup special will send Billy Sandow against Bullet Bob Cummings. After three straight local draws, Sandow last week spilled Bill Fletcher for his first win here. Sandow is a top-notch, but has found the competition rather rough in these parts. The 8:30 o'clock opener has The Black Prince, undefeated locally, facing Fletcher. The masked Prince, who holds wins over Leo Wallick and Maurice LaChapelle

Owen also announces that Frank Stojack's injured knee is responding to treatment and that Frank will be back in action soon. Owen is also attempting to lure Coast junior heavy champ Rogers Mackay back for a title outing here. The U. S. Hornsby Replaces Sewell As Cincinnati Manager

Rajah Signed For 1953, Too

CINCINNATI (AP)—The Cincinnati Reds Monday night named Rogers Hornsby as new manager to replace Duke Sewell, who resigned earlier Monday. Cabel Paul, general manager of the Cincinnati baseball club, announced from New York that Hornsby will be manager through the balance of the season and through 1953.

Paul said Hornsby will continue scouting for the Reds in the meantime until taking over the club. Paul said Luke Sewell will continue as manager of the Reds through the series that closes Wednesday night.

In 1950, Hornsby led Beaumont to the Texas League pennant and in 1951 led Seattle to the Pacific Coast League crown.

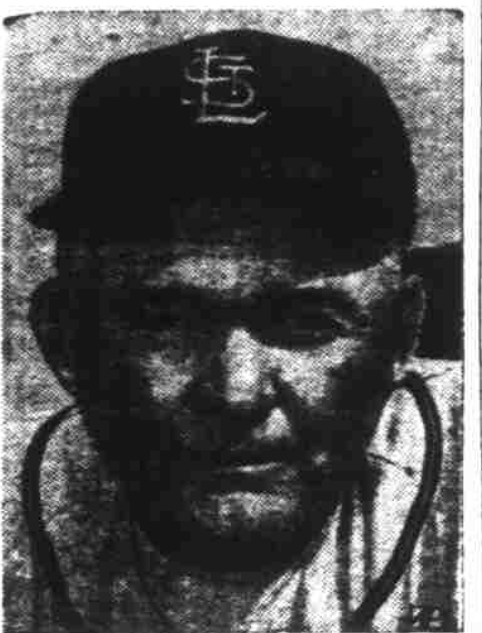
Hornsby, 56, led the National League hitters for seven years from 1920 through 1925 and in 1928. A second baseman, he had a lifetime batting average of .359, the highest in National League history.

In 1924, he hit .424 to establish the 20th century major league record. He also led the St. Louis Cardinals to their first pennant and world championship in 1926. He also managed the Boston Braves and the Chicago Cubs.

He piloted the St. Louis Browns earlier this year until ousted by owner Bill Veeck recently. In a statement, Paul said: "Mr. Crowley (Powell Crosley Jr.) and I decided on Rogers Hornsby to lead the Reds because we feel him to be the type of manager best suited for our particular situation."

"He is baseball through and through and he has demonstrated that winning is paramount to him. I am confident he will do a good job and the fans of Cincinnati will like him."

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Polly Riley of Fort Worth, Tex., a member of the U. S. Curtis Cup team, knocked two strokes off ladies' par Monday to lead the field of qualifiers for the annual Women's Western Amateur golf championship.

The husky Texas Miss toured the difficult Los Angeles Country Club's North course, 6,254 yards with a par of 37-38-75, in a fashion as hot as the weather—35-38-73. Man's par is 72.

Thirty-two of the lowest scorers in a field of approximately 175 qualified for the championship flight and the first round of match play, which begins Tuesday.

Lyle Bowman, Richmond, Calif., and formerly of Portland, at 77; and two threats for the title, California's Barbara Romack and Pat Lesser of Seattle, at 79. Misses Riley and DeMoss are members of the 1952 Curtis Cup team.

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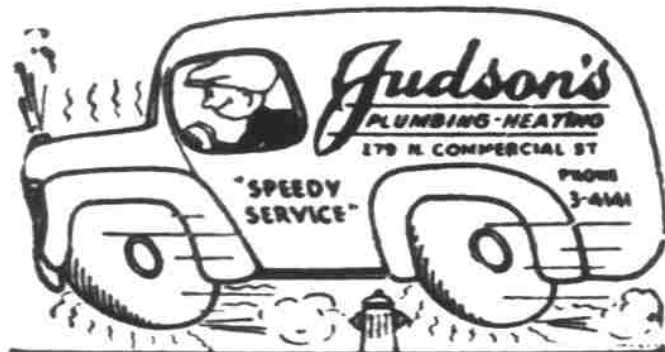
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
