Two American boxers won to advance the semi-finals and two were eliminated in daytime fights. Nate Brooks of Cleveland won a split decision over Mircea Dobrescu of Romania in the flyweight class.

Adkins Advances Adkins, light welterweight from Gary, Ind., took an unanimous decision over Alex Webster of South Africa, dropping him to the canvas twice.

Three cycling championships were settled. Russell Mockridge of Australia won the 1,000 meter time trial in the Olympic record time of 1:11.1 one tenth of one second under the old mark. He then teamed with Lionel Cox to beat the South African combination of R. L. Robinson and Thomas Shareldow in the 2,000 meter tandem race.

A Destruction Derby was held at the bowl last year and wowed a turnaway crowd with almost four hours of bumps, bangs and bruises.
