# Grass Is Gold Contest Will Close Aug. 15

Reports from many counties in Oregon indicate a growing interest in the 1952 "Grass is Gold" program, according to James Coon, chairman of the State Cow-Clover Contest. Coon said that 36 counties were entered last year, and that the contest is expected to attract even more entries this year. The contest is designed to encourage the use of grass and clover in agriculture, and to promote the production of high-quality livestock. The contest is held annually, and the winner is awarded a cash prize and a trophy. The contest is open to all farmers and ranchers in Oregon, and the entries are judged on the basis of the quality of the grass and clover produced. The contest is a popular event, and it is expected to continue for many years to come.

# Prizes Are Large

Initiated by the agricultural committee of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, one of the principal features of the program is the naming of an Oregon "Grassman of the Year" who will compete with finalists from Idaho and Washington for the regional title and a \$15,000 irrigation system or other equipment award presented by R. T. Wade & Company of Portland. The Oregon winner will also receive \$500 cash award from the United States National Bank. Contests are now underway to select county winners who will be entered in the state contest. The Portland Chamber for the first time this year is arranging for scrolls to be presented to each county "Grassman of the Year."

Local county contests are sponsored by various organizations, chambers of commerce, kiwanis and rotary clubs, cattlemen's associations and others, with county agents acting as coordinators. Several counties have arranged for special awards and trophies in addition. This phase of the 1952 contest is slated to close on August 15, deadline for entrance in the state contest. The Oregon award will be presented at the state fair in Salem early in September. Oregon winner for 1951 was Walter Lierman of Independence. Harold Smith of Darlington, Idaho won the regional award which was presented at the Pacific International Livestock Exposition last October.

Purpose of the contest and the "Grass is Gold" program is to stimulate improvement of pasture and range lands through the use of grasses better suited to the land, more carefully controlled management and other such improvements, with an eye to increasing in large degree the livestock industry of the region.

# Grain Market Pounds Ahead

CHICAGO (AP)—Grains pounded ahead on the board of trade Wednesday as public interest in the market heightened. Soybeans led the advance and all deliveries of this commodity finished far above the \$3.00 mark. With numerous new season high made, the 1952 crop of soybeans, corn and oats were all selling at their best prices of the year. A feature of the trade was a pick-up in the demand for wheat. The bread cereal has pretty much lagged on the current forward thrust. Wheat closed 1 1/2 - 2 1/4 higher, corn 2 to 3 1/4 higher, oats 1 1/2 - 2 1/4 higher, rye 1/2 to 2 cents higher, soybeans 6 1/4 - 7 1/4 higher, and lard 5 to 17 cents a hundred pounds higher.

# Rail Issues Boost Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—A few favored railroad issues boosted the stock market to a new 1952 high Wednesday by a narrow margin. Gains among the carriers ranged to more than a point. But there were frequent losers too, and action over the entire list was spotty.

Almost the only other section to show much steadiness was the aircraft issues where fractional advances prevailed.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks, with a climb of 10 cents at \$109.50, reached its highest level since June 10, 1950.

Rails in the average rose 30 cents, utilities were up 20 cents, and a new 1952 high of \$53.50, and industrials dropped 30 cents.
