State Orders Hog Quarantine

An order placing a 30-day quarantine on importation into Oregon of hogs from areas in which vesicular exanthema disease is known to exist was signed Thursday by E. L. Peterson, State Agricultural Department director, and Gov. Douglas McKay.

Vesicular exanthema is an extremely communicable and contagious disease of livestock not previously prevalent in Oregon, officials said. Since the outbreak of the disease last month in the Midwest, federal quarantine has been placed against two Oregon counties, Multnomah and Marion, parts of 14 other states, and all of California.

The Oregon agricultural department has placed a temporary ban on shipments into Oregon to clear up the situation here and prevent further introduction of the disease.

Salary Boost Denial Decried By Pearson

State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson, upon his return here Thursday from the Democratic National Convention in Chicago, expressed disappointment at the recent action of the state emergency board and Gov. Douglas McKay in not approving a wage increase for state workers in the lower pay brackets.

Pearson is a member of the State Board of Control. Pay raises were approved for most other state employees, excepting engineers, prison guards, liquor store employees and those in the academic classification, during Pearson's absence. Wages of engineers and prison guards were increased a few months previously.

"I think it is most regrettable that employees in the lower salary brackets should not receive pay increases," Pearson said. "A \$5 increase would have meant more to employees in the lower brackets than a \$25 or \$30 increase for higher paid employees."

Pearson said he would oppose any pay increase which does not include all employees and particularly those in the lower wage brackets.
