

## Milk Price Rise Forecast

WASHINGTON (AP)—The family milk bill will go higher in the month ahead, the Agriculture Department predicted Tuesday.

In a report on the dairy situation, the department said a late summer and fall decline in milk production coupled with strong consumer demands for dairy products is expected to push prices higher.

Milk output normally drops off at this time of year, reflecting the effect of hot weather on pastures. The severe drought in the South and Northeast already has cut production considerably below normal.

The department made no forecast on how much prices of fluid milk, butter, cheese and other dairy products will rise.

## Destroyer Gets Full Blame for Carrier Crash

WASHINGTON (AP)—A Naval court of inquiry announced Tuesday that the "sole cause" of the disastrous mid-Atlantic collision between the carrier Wasp and the destroyer-minesweeper Hobson on April 26 was an "unexplained left turn" made by the destroyer.

A total of 176 crewman died in the sinking of the Hobson.

The court said Lt. Cmdr. W. J. Tierney, skipper of the Hobson, "committed a grave error in judgment" in making the turn. The Hobson was run down by the 32,000-ton carrier. Tierney died in the collision.

The court, which began its hearings immediately after the badly-damaged Wasp reached New York last May, absolved all other officers on both ships of any responsibility for the accident—one of the worst peacetime disasters in U. S. Naval history.

The three-admiral court said both vessels were in good condition and that no material, mechanical or electronic failures in either ship contributed to or caused the collision.

## Court Closes Yoder Estate

A Marion County probate court order Tuesday closed the estate of Levi Lawrence Yoder, 70, killed when struck by a truck July 21 near Hubbard.

A payment of \$856 by West Coast Freight Inc., owner of the truck, to the surviving widow and children as settlement of a liability claim was authorized by the court order.

Yoder met death while walking along the Pacific Highway about one mile south of Hubbard. The freight company and driver, Harry A. Mattis, denied negligence. Yoder resided at Woodburn.

## Russia Asked to Join Austria Pact

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States, Britain and France have prodded Russia again to join in providing "an immediate and just" treaty establishing Austria's independence and freedom from military occupation.

Western capitals released the text of a brief note to Moscow Tuesday night. It had been delivered to the Kremlin Monday.

## Mishaps Involving Minors Increase

Since school let out there has been an increase in industrial accidents to boys and girls because minors are filling up summer jobs, according to a report made by State Labor Commissioner W. E. Kimsey.

Some 6,000 permits for employment of minors under 18 have been issued to employers each summer. During the first week of August, 37 minors were injured on the job compared to 47 injured for the entire month of July and 28 in June. Approximately 132 industrial accidents to minors have been reported in the last four months.

## Margaret Leaves For Denmark Tour

BERLIN (AP)—Margaret Truman left Berlin by special train Tuesday night for Denmark on the last leg of her European tour.

The President's daughter met several hundred American, British, French and German officials at a reception given by Cecil Lyon, chief of the State Department's Berlin office. She commented that her trip has been strenuous and exciting.

She is travelling in a special train assigned to the U. S. high commissioner in Germany.
