CHICAGO (AP)—Most grains drifted lower through a quiet session on the board of trade Friday, although the new crop soybean contracts rallied in the final minutes to close higher.

Soybeans provided most of the trading activity. They opened higher on pretty brisk demand, but quickly faltered. Demand did not grow important again until the last 10 or 15 minutes. In other cereals there was some week end selling by local traders.

Wheat closed 1/4-1/2 lower, corn unchanged to 1/4 lower, oats 1/4-1/2 lower, rye 1/4-1/2 lower, soybeans 1/4 lower to 1/4 higher and lard 10 to 15 cents a hundred pounds lower.
