## N.Y. Central Rail Peace Plan Rejected

**NEW YORK** (P) — Union negotiators rejected a government plan to end the long-simmering strike threat against the New York Central Railroad's eastern lines. But there was no apparent danger of an immediate walk-out.

After the union's refusal to accept the plan, the government mediators promptly asked that a temporary "status quo" be maintained. The railroad earlier had accepted the government plan.

The mediators dispatched telegrams to the chiefs of the four unions involved and to the New York Central asking both sides to an emergency meeting in Washington Tuesday morning.

In Cleveland, where three of the unions have headquarters, a spokesman said the Engineers, firemen and conductors had agreed to the request for the Tuesday meeting.

Details of the government proposal have not been disclosed, but the mediators said it covered everything involved in a two-year dispute over some 58 grievances.
