Briefs Filed in Dr. Buck Case

Both the state and the defense have filed briefs in Oregon Supreme court in the case involving Dr. George H. Buck, Portland, under five years sentence for manslaughter in Portland.

AMMAN, Jordan (AP)—The Jordanian government and the United States Point Four Administration have signed an agreement covering the development of Jordan's water resources, irrigation and pastures. The United States will contribute \$459,523 and Jordan \$107,265.
