

Dot Kirby Among Upset Victims in Amateur Go

Anderson Licks 1951 Champion

Polly Riley, DeMoss, Lenczyk Also Ousted

By HUGH FULLERTON JR. PORTLAND (AP) — Edean Anderson, a husky Nordic-blue eyed clouter from Helena, Mont., took defending champion Dorothy Kirby out of the Women's National Golf Championship Wednesday like a Minnesota halfback taking out an end.

Leading the way as an uprising of youth sent a whole flock of stars to the sidelines in the third round, Miss Anderson beat the grim-faced Georgian, 4 and 3, to enter Thursday's quarter final round.

The 22-year-old Edean, who left Oregon State College because she'd "rather play golf than keep my nose in a book," played one-over-par golf for the 16 holes the third round match lasted. Miss Kirby, who barely squeaked through to an extra-hole victory over Mary Agnes Wall of Menominee, Mich., in the second round this morning, continued to play badly.

Got Breaks
Dot got the breaks in the morning, when her rival drove out of bounds on the extra hole and then her own blast from a bunker rolled back down a bank onto the green. But this afternoon Miss Anderson was just too good a golfer for her.

Along with Miss Kirby, Polly Riley, the Women's Western Champion from Fort Worth, Tex.; Grace Lenczyk, the 1948 national champion from Newington, Conn.; and Curtis Cup players Grace De Moss and Mae Murray were eliminated in the third round. Another Curtis Cupper, Marjorie Lindsay of Decatur, Ill., went out Wednesday morning.

Miss De Moss bowed to Mrs. Jacqueline Fung, Honolulu, 4 and 3. Pat Lesser, Seattle, topped Bee McWane, Birmingham, 9 and 7 and Barbara Snook, Portland, dined Mae Murray, Rutland, Vt., 3 and 1. Earlier in the second round Miss De Moss beat Mrs. Maurice Glick, Baltimore, 2 and 1.

Annual Event Starts Friday Aussie, Connolly Liked In National Net Tourney

NEW YORK (AP) — Defending champions Frank Sedgman of Australia and Maureen Connolly of San Diego, Calif., were top-seeded as expected Wednesday for the National Lawn Tennis Championships starting at Forest Hills Friday.

Sedgman, winner of the Wimbledon title as well as the U. S. crown, was ranked first in the foreign section. Vic Seixas of Philadelphia, the No. 1 American, topped the domestic division. The Australian routed Seixas in the Forest Hills final last year, 6-4, 6-4, 6-1.

Hart Seeded Second
The 17-year-old Maureen, who matched Sedgman's feat by also winning at Wimbledon, was followed in the women's seedings by Doris Hart, of Jacksonville, Miss. Hart, former Wimbledon queen, has been runner-up at Forest Hills three times but she has never won the American championship. Thelma Long of Australia was seeded first in the foreign division.

Behind Seixas in the men's domestic division came Dick Savit, Orange, N. J., Art Larsen, San Leandro, Calif., and Herb Flam, Beverly Hills, Calif.

Locke Captures Links Honors

MONTREAL (AP) — Bobby Locke, British Open champion from South Africa, defeated Julius Boros, United States Open titleholder by a margin of two holes Wednesday in the Canada-United States professional team golf competition, won by the United States with 20½ points to 6½ for Canada.

Locke had to share 18-hole scoring honors with Boros, from Southern Pines, N. C. The South African, playing with the Canadian team, was three up in the morning 18-hole round but Boros had a one-hole margin in the afternoon.

Locke's morning lead and his over-all victory for 36 holes gave Canada two points.

Atlantic Fish Now in Oregon

The Atlantic salmon, renowned for its fighting qualities and its tendency to strike freely at an artificial fly, has been liberated in Oregon waters. Game commission fish tankers this month hauled 2,500 Atlantic salmon to Odell creek, outlet to Odell lake and tributary to Davis lake near the Willamett highway. The salmon, ranging from 5 to 9 inches in length, were reared at Wizard Falls fish hatchery.

Eggs for the Atlantic salmon stocking program were sent from Canada's Gaspe peninsula in March 1951 by the Quebec department of game and fisheries as a gift to the people of Oregon. Another 3,000 Atlantic salmon are being raised at Klamath fish hatchery.

The Odell creek release site was chosen by the commission's fishery staff because adjacent Davis lake is rich in aquatic food and the eastern salmon should develop rapidly there.

Lone Oak Track Ready For 7-Day Racing Meet

Venerable Lone Oak track, in tip top shape for the 87th State Fair, is the mecca for some of the Northwest's best thoroughbreds as they await the opening of the Fair's seven-day turf program Saturday.

Racing Superintendent Charles Evans reports the Lone Oak stalls to be jammed to their greatest capacity in history, among the late comers being some of the top horses from the recent Seattle Longacres meet.

Purses for the feature races this year are the highest in State Fair history. The Governor's Handicap on Wednesday and the Au Revoir Handicap on the final day have been jumped from \$800 to \$1,000. The inaugural 'Cap of opening day will offer a purse of \$800 as compared to \$600 last year. In addition, two quarter-horse features on Labor Day and the final Saturday carry \$500 purses. Another fixture is the Labor Day handicap.

A crew has been working on the pari-mutuel machines all week, getting them ready for heavy business.

The daily racing cards will include nine events. There will be no turf program on Sunday. Post time for the Saturday opener is 1:15.
