Fain Musial Lead Leagues

NEW YORK (AP)—Ferris Fain, defending American League batting champion, is showing signs of faltering in his bid to retain the title, but his closest pursuers also are slumping in the stretch.

In the National League, Stan Musial held a 15 points advantage over Ted Kluszewski. The Cardinals' slugger moved up two points to .355 with a 10-for-26 effort while Kluszewski showed a four-point improvement to .320.

Two unbeatens hurlers, Sandy Consuegra of Washington in the American League and Al Corwin of the New York Giants in the National, topped the pitchers in percentage. Consuegra showed a 6-0 record while Corwin's was 5-0.
