

1st Round Firing Set in SGC Tourney

Field of 80 After Honors

Sederstorm, Powell, Price Early Victors

First-round action in the Salem Golf Club's annual Championship tournament is due to be completed by the Sunday night deadline as a field of around 80 swingers seek honors in ten flights.

Three matches already have been completed in the Championship flight, which has Jimmy Sheldon as defending king. Bob Sederstorm got over his first hurdle as he topped Del Gwynn 2 and 1, Hobart Price, a southpaw divotter, downed George Hencken 3 and 2 and Bob Powell beat B. J. Schaefer 2 and 1.
