

## Frank Pate, Linn County Native, Dies

**ALBANY** — Funeral services for Frank C. Pate, 72, will be held from the Fisher Funeral Home Monday at 2 p.m. with the Rev. Morton Booth officiating and interment at Lebanon IOOF Cemetery.

Pate died Thursday of a heart attack while visiting friends. The son of James W. and Viola Archibald Pate, Oregon pioneers, Pate was born at Jefferson Feb. 18, 1880, living in Jefferson until 1908. He attended the Looney Butte School and was later graduated from Oregon State College. In 1908 he came to Albany and established Pate Creamery, operating it until 1943 when he retired. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church and the IOOF and BPOE Lodges.

Twice married, his first wife was Belle Donac whom he married in Salem in 1911. She died in 1944 and on Nov. 16, 1947, in Albany he married Mrs. Mabel Beauchamp. She survives as do a daughter, Mrs. Nathell Irwin, Carmel, Calif.; two step-children, Mrs. Harlow Weinrick, Albany, and Dr. Harvey Beauchamp, Hayward, Calif.; one brother, James G. Pate, Jefferson; also three sisters and one grandson.
