Beck Outlines New BMA Procedure

A new procedure which farmers must follow in signing up for conservation practice payments for 1953 has been ordered by the U. S. department of agriculture, reports J. R. Beck, of the Oregon production marketing association.

The change, Beck said, requires a new step in filing for next year payments and must be completed before the end of December. He advised all Oregon farmers wishing to file for payments to begin now in setting up their 1953 programs.

In order for farmers to qualify for agricultural conservation program practice payments next year, they must file a list before December 31 of the practices they intend to follow. This list should be submitted to the county PMA committee and must show the practices in order of their priority.

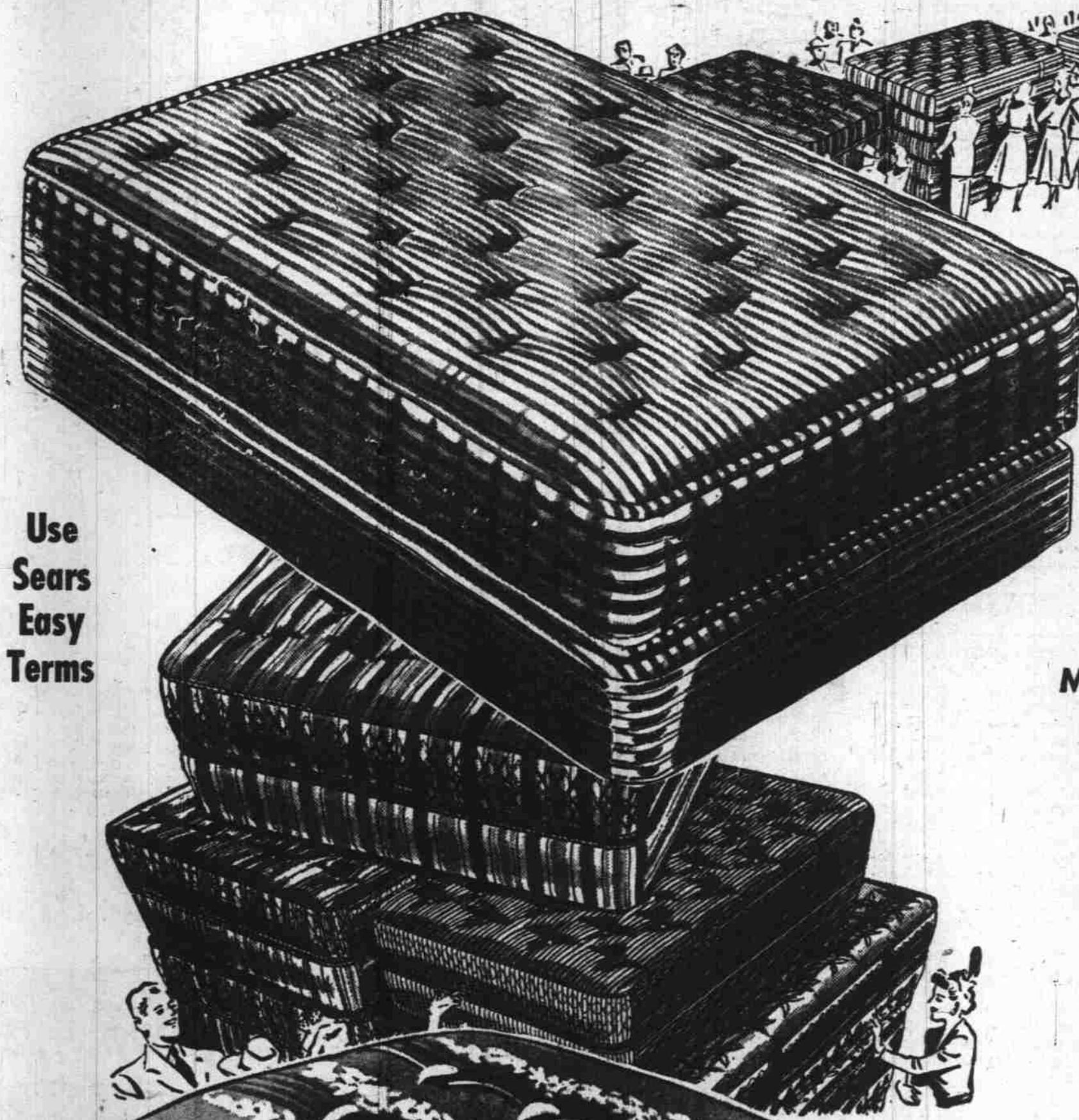
Standardization Cuts Plane Costs

NEW YORK — Standardization of service specifications for the aircraft industry has resulted in savings of millions of dollars for the taxpayer, says Aircraft Industries Association.

The Statesman, Salem, Oregon, Thursday, October 16, 1952—3
designs have standardized 19,419 hardware parts for aircraft engines and propellers alone. A typical saving, the association says, is that of an engine bolt and nut which cost \$2.63 before standardization. Now it costs \$1.
The association says power-plant makers with service contracts will use 78 million fewer kinds of parts this year than formerly.

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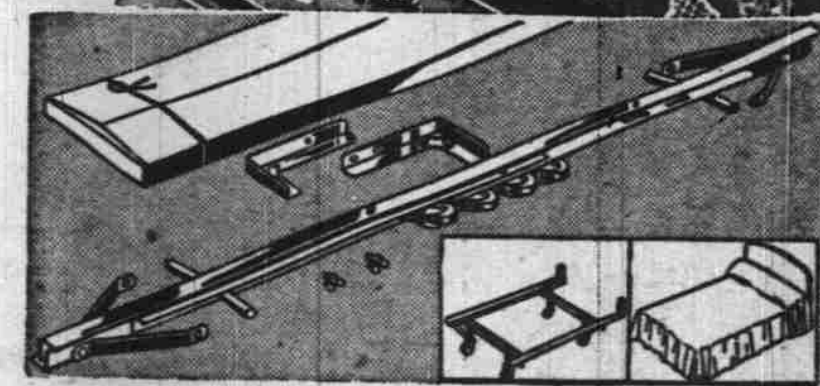
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
