

# 3,000 in Salem for Week-end Church Conferences

## Witnesses Plan Preaching in Salem Homes

Jehovah's Witnesses from Northwest Oregon launched their circuit assembly in Salem High School Friday night, with about 1,000 persons present. That number is expected to double today and Sunday.

Today's program will feature a symposium on "Proper Love" at 1:30 p.m. Speakers will be W. V. Olmsted, Portland minister; E. C. Kennedy, circuit minister, and L. E. Reisch, district minister from Watchtower headquarters in Brooklyn, N. Y.

On Sunday at 9 a.m., Reusch will give a discourse on baptism, after which candidates will be taken to the YMCA pool for immersion. After that, at the school, J. B. Hammetton, company servant of the Salem congregation, will conduct a meeting to instruct the persons who will call on homes in Salem area Sunday.

Feature meeting will be at 3 p.m. Sunday, open to the public, with Reusch speaking on "Where Is This World Heading?"

Volunteers are serving meals to convention attendants at the school cafeteria.

## Capital Baptist to Commence Building Project on Sunday

**CAPITAL BAPTIST**—2-25-2 ch. Groundbreaking ceremony for the new Capital Baptist Church is slated for 3 p.m. Sunday at the 3000 Lansing Ave. site, just south of Silverton Road.

The day's program will include regular morning services at the Seventh Day Adventist Church, with Dr. R. E. Millam of Portland, executive secretary of the Baptist General Convention for Oregon and Washington, speaking. At noon the congregation will have a basket dinner at Bush Pasture Park.

The building ceremony will be participated in by Dr. Millam; the Rev. and Mrs. Roland Hood, who led in founding the Salem's work of the Southern Baptist denomination two years ago; C. E. Boyle, editor of Pacific Coast Baptist, and John T. Sizemore, heading Sunday school and Training Union work for Oregon and Washington. All are from Portland.

Preparations for the foundation have been started, according to the Rev. E. Frost, pastor. The first unit, to cost some \$30,000, will have a temporary sanctuary and 18 classrooms. Eventually it will be part of the educational section of a building to care for 1,000 persons.

The 112 by 72 foot L-shaped structure will face west on a five-acre tract. It will be largely of gunnite concrete, with some open-beam construction inside.

John Grimmer Groom of Salem is the architect. A builder will be employed to direct labor by the congregation. It is planned to occupy the church by April 1.
