

Zoners Send Sidewalk Bill Back to Council

The long-suffering sidewalk ordinance bill began another trek back to Salem City Council Tuesday night, recommended again by the City Planning and Zoning Commission. It also approved zoning revision for a supermarket on Broadway at the north edge of the city.

A special committee of the commission headed by Robert Stanley said reconsideration of the problem at the council's request brought the feeling that "in justice to property owners, we can only recommend passage of the ordinance as proposed before."

Faced with the problem of lack of sidewalks not installed though required by ordinance and the debate between standard or curb sidewalks, the Council two years ago asked the commission to revise the law. It did, but the Council passed up consideration when backlogs saw the bill lack votes for passage.

The bill, which probably will be brought off the table by the Council, provides principally for variance from a strict requirement that walks be built at the same time as streets. It would allow curb walks or no walks at all if a majority of the property owners agree.

Change Favored

The commission recommended a change from Class III, Special to Class III (business) zoning on the east side of Broadway between Tryon and Blier Avenues to permit a proposed supermarket. It made the restriction that the building must be set back from property lines 20 feet.

Representing the owners, R. J. Schmidt, realtor, said plans call for the market, with many types of businesses, to be leased by F. M. Hughes, operator of the Kelzer Supermarket. The property is owned by Lee Ohmart, Rody Calaba, James Young and Commonwealth, Inc. Building plans are not complete.

The commission tabled, until further information is secured, proposed annexation of Watkins Addition, a 32-lot subdivision south of Orchard Heights Road and east of Parkway Drive. The owners, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Watkins and Mr. and Mrs. James Rowland, said they would not request any city services now except water from an adjacent main. Zoners felt, however, that the area would complicate rather than straighten city boundary lines and further study should be made.

Other Action

The commission also: Denied Hobart Price permission to build a house on a partial lot on Fairmount Street which does not meet minimum area requirements. While Price and one neighbor favored the variance, three neighbors opposed changing building rules.

Expressed regret at the resignation of R. A. Forkner and appreciation for his long service to the city.

Welcomed Vernal D. McMullen as Forkner's replacement and Robert K. Powell as temporary replacement for Milton L. Meyers.

Welcomed W. W. Rosebraugh back as chairman after an absence due to illness.

Authorized resubdivision of two blocks of City View Cemetery to eliminate passageways between graveplots, allowing more graves of the type marked by lawn plaques rather than stones.

Search planes flew over Central and Southern Oregon again Tuesday without reporting any sign of the Logans.

Motorcyclist Hurt in Wreck

Hunters Wait For Permits to Enter Burn

Hunters will probably be allowed to enter the Tillamook Burn area Thursday, State Forester George Spaur said Tuesday night, although no permits to enter are now being issued to them.

The closure on the burn was lifted at midnight Monday by Gov. Douglas McKay. But Spaur said that inasmuch as the regular deer season ended Sunday, he saw no reason why any permits to enter the burn be issued to hunters until the special buck deer season opens Thursday morning.

Loggers are being allowed to enter the Tillamook Burn on a permit basis, Spaur said. However, hunters who applied for permits at the Forest Grove headquarters Tuesday were turned down Spaur said, and no permits would be issued there until Thursday.

Most forests in Western Oregon are now open on a permit basis. There are some in the Cascade Mountains which have been closed all summer to both logging and any other type of activity, and probably will not be opened until later in the fall. These will also be closed to hunters.

The two and a half million acres of O & C lands in Western Oregon will also be opened to hunters Thursday the Bureau of Land Management said Tuesday. The lands are now open to loggers, although slash burning has not been authorized.

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Large Crowds Cheer Truman On East Coast

EN ROUTE WITH PRESIDENT TRUMAN IN PENNSYLVANIA (AP)—President Truman, drawing some of the biggest crowds of his career, blasted Dwight D. Eisenhower across New Jersey and Pennsylvania Tuesday in an all-out drive to capture the working man's vote for Adlai E. Stevenson. He wound up an exhausting day with a Pottsville, Pa., speech declaring it is a "dead sure cinch" that the Republicans will wipe out all price and rent control if they get into office in the Nov. 4 election.

Truman was mad, and he frankly acknowledged that Eisenhower was getting under his skin with talk of "Democratic high prices." He moved into the hard coal country with a free-swinging counter-attack on Republicans in Congress who voted against his controls proposals.

"I won't let them get away with it," he declared in his Pottsville speech. In all the campaigning he has done this year, Truman has seen nothing like the huge, cheering crowds that pressed in on his motorcade as it wound through the big North Jersey centers of Jersey City and Newark about on the way to Philadelphia and Pennsylvania points north and west.

Pennsylvania produces more coal than any other of the United States.
