The congregation was organized formally on Oct. 23, 1927, by the Rev. Luther B. Deck, at that time pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Vancouver, Wash. After making numerous trips to Salem for preaching engagements, at the direction of the synodical missions committee, the formal organization was effected with 43 charter members.

The name of the congregation was changed from The American Lutheran Church to St. Mark's Lutheran Church in 1941.

During the 25 years four pastors have served the congregation: Dr. Deck, deceased; the Rev. P. W. Erickson, retired; the Rev. M. A. Getzendorf, D.D., retired, and the present pastor, the Rev. John L. Cagle, who came to Salem a year ago.

The growth of this congregation has been steady over the period of years. At present its membership consists of 455 confirmed and 691 baptized (including unconfirmed children).

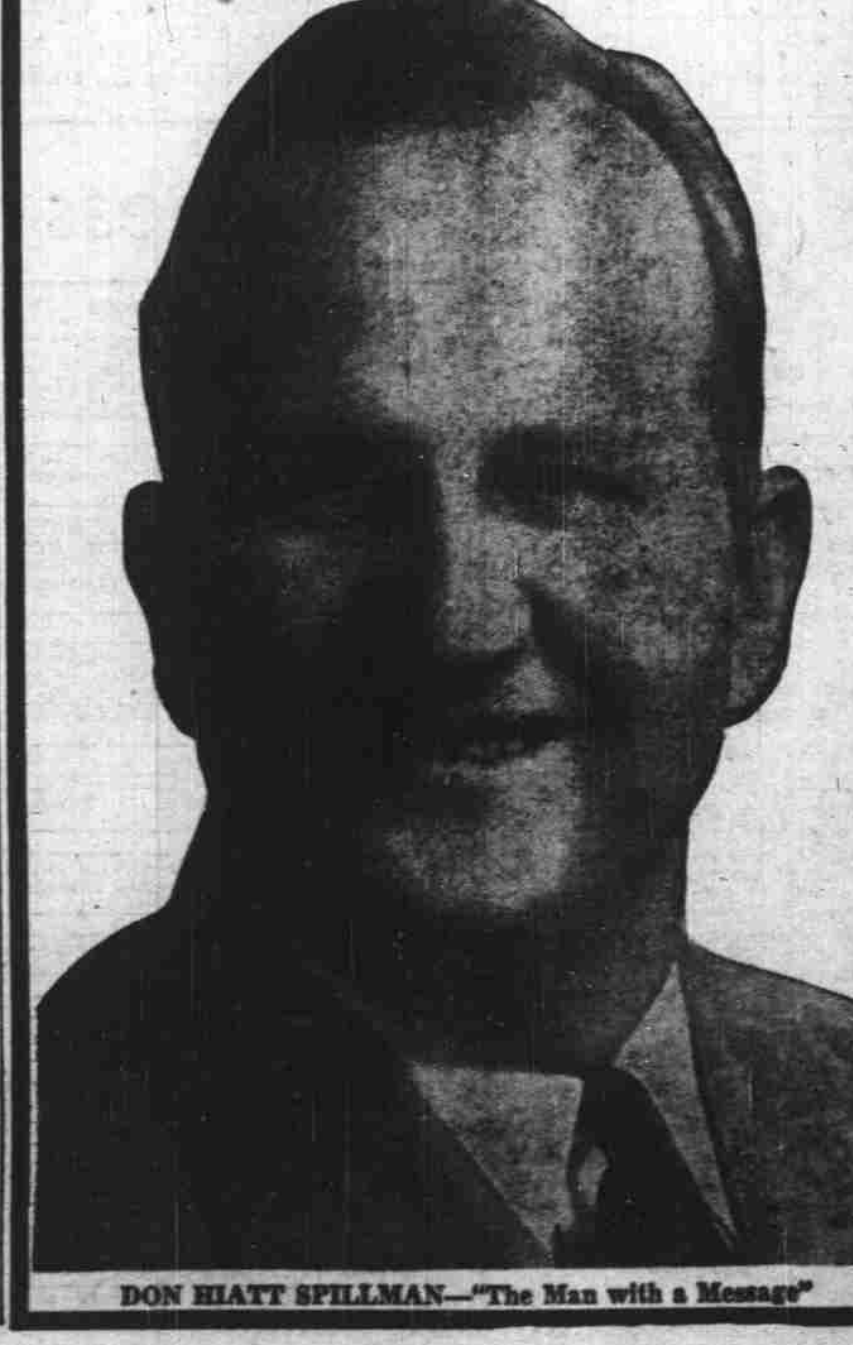
