CHICAGO (P)- Corn led grains higher at the start of Tuesday's board of trade session, and at the finish was the only pit in which plus signs predominated.

Early buying reflected reports of export business, but toward the close when some profit cashing set in, offerings became liberal indicating that the limited export business had been discounted.

The finish was weak with wheat % to 1% lower than the previous close, corn was % to 1% higher, oats were % to % higher, rye was unchanged to 11/2 lower, soybeans were ¼ to 2 cents lower and lard was 8 to 17 cents a hundred pounds lower.


