

Portland Mayor Contest 'Going Down to Wire'

PORTLAND (AP) — Mayor Dorothy McCullough Lee and City Commissioner Fred L. Peterson, who ran against her in the mayoralty race, were engaged Tuesday night in a see-saw battle that might not be settled until the last vote is in.

When the counting stopped at midnight, Peterson was ahead 31-100 to 30,660. These returns were from 454 of the city's 616 precincts.

A Republican tidal wave swept 16 of the 18 GOP candidates for the State Legislature from Multnomah County into the lead.

For the five Senate seats, Republicans S. Eugene Allen, Milton E. Kahn, Pat Lonergan and John C. F. Merrifield were ahead. So was State Sen. Richard L. Neuberger, Democrat.

But trailing for the Senate were such Democrats as State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson, and Sens. Thomas R. Mahoney and Jack Bain.

These returns were far from conclusive, however.

The only Democratic candidate for the House of Representatives who was leading was Rep. Maurice Neuberger, wife of Sen. Neuberger. The other top 12 are all Republicans.

Stanley Earl was elected city commissioner, and Nathan A. E. Bonnett's unexpired term on the city council.

PORTLAND (AP) — Portland's two candidates for mayor spent more than \$35,000 in the campaign, reports of their committees showed Tuesday.

Expenditure for Mayor Dorothy McCullough Lee, seeking re-election, was \$18,248 by the committee. Two other backers spent \$903 for Mrs. Lee, who said she spent nothing. That made her total \$19,251.

Fred L. Peterson, the other candidate, reported he spent \$500 and his committee \$16,169.

Mrs. Lee's committee reported a deficit of \$2,059 and Peterson's committee reported \$3,278 in unpaid bills and \$417 cash on hand.

Cutsforth Wins Gervais Race

GERVAIS — Gervais voters returned young Mayor Rex J. Cutsforth to office by a wide margin Tuesday. Complete returns gave Cutsforth 104 votes and Francis Lenhart 31.

For City Council posts, Chris Reis, incumbent, and Emil Ronner, while Cecil Omans, incumbent, and Edward Studer were chosen for two-year terms. The totals: Ronner, 109, Reis, 77, L. J. Finley 68; Omans, 96, Studer, 84, A. L. Roberts, 66.

Mrs. Henry Steger, city recorder, and Mrs. Donald Gould, city treasurer, were re-elected without opposition.

SEN. JENNER WINS INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Democratic Gov. Henry F. Schricker early Wednesday conceded that William Jenner had defeated him in their Senate race. Jenner, a controversial figure in even the presidential campaign, had 619,718 to 577,994 for Schricker in 2,231 of 4,202 precincts.

SYMINGTON LEADS ST. LOUIS, Mo. (AP) — Former Navy Secretary Stuart Symington (D) took a lead of 510,578 to 481,996 over Sen. Kem in this state's Senate race Tuesday, with returns in from 3,135 of 4,771 precincts.

98 PER CENT AT LIBERTY LIBERTY — A record smashing 98 per cent of the registered voters in Liberty precinct turned out to vote in Tuesday's general election. Harold Rosebraugh of that precinct reported.

PUERTO RICANS SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) — Puerto Rico, voting for the first time under its new commonwealth constitution, elected a legislature of 51 representatives and 27 senators Tuesday. It was believed nearly 600,000 voters of the 832,000 registered, went to the polls.

CROOK COUNTY FOR GOP PRINEVILLE (AP) — Crook County, which never has failed to support the winner in a presidential election, remained true to form.

In six of the county's 15 precincts, Gen. Eisenhower held a 535 to 256 lead over Governor Stevenson.

WILLIAMS TAKES POST WILMINGTON, Del. (AP) — Sen. John Williams (R) led Alexis Bayard in the Delaware Senate race early Wednesday by 78,050 to 58,651 votes in 240 of 278 precincts.

NO COMPLAINTS RECEIVED WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department said shortly after 4 p.m. (EST), Tuesday that it had not received a single complaint concerning the nation-wide voting for the presidency—a rarity for a general election.

In his bid for re-election, McCarthy led Democrat Thomas E. Fairchild 419,376 to 292,873 in 1,857 of 3,225 precincts.

Sheriff Jones Holds Lead in Yamhill Race

McMINNVILLE — Sheriff W. J. Jones held a 1,136 to 824 lead for re-election over W. H. Kerr, Democratic candidate, on returns from 7 of 36 Yamhill County precincts at midnight Tuesday.

Coroner Glen C. Macy, also a Republican, was leading David J. Boss for re-election in the county's other contested office. Macy had 1,232 votes; Boss 460.

Rollin Wood, Republican, led Frank Holmes for Justice of the Peace in McMinnville District by 835 to 539 on returns from five of seven precincts.

Carl H. Francis, incumbent, and George Layman, both Republicans, were elected as state representatives without opposition.

Truman Sleeps While Ike Wins

ABOARD TRUMAN TRAIN (AP) President Harry S. Truman went to bed early Tuesday night, long before it was official that he will be succeeded in January by Gen. Dwight Eisenhower.

After voting at Independence, the president went aboard his train for the return trip to Washington, D. C., giving every outward show of optimism. Asked by reporters whether he was "sure this is a winner," Truman replied with a grin, "Of course, no question about it."

MALONE HOLDS SLIGHT MARGIN IN NEVADA CARSON CITY, Nev. (AP) — Sen. George Malone (R) held a slight lead over Tom Mechling (D) early Wednesday in Nevada's Senate race. Malone had 12,356 votes to Mechling's 10,994 in 170 of 353 precincts.

North Carolina GOP Vote is Highest Ever RALEIGH, N. C. (AP) — North Carolina gave its 14 electoral votes to Adlai Stevenson Tuesday but gave Dwight Eisenhower the largest vote ever accorded a Republican candidate.

In 1,719 of 2,036 precincts the vote was 544,962 for Stevenson and 440,753 for Eisenhower, the largest total balloting in the state's history.

Cardwell, Savage Lead in Linn Race

ALBANY — Ed R. Cardwell, incumbent, and Jess W. Savage, Republicans, were leading for two Linn County state representative posts on returns from 13 of 78 precincts at midnight Tuesday.

Walter Kropp, Republican, was leading Glen Huston, the incumbent, for coroner in the only contested county race. Kropp had 1,841 votes and Huston, Democratic candidate, 777.

BLAIR MOODY TRAILING LANSING, Mich. (AP) — Democrat Blair Moody was trailing in Charles Potter in Michigan's Senate race Tuesday by 250,290 to 202,620 votes in 710 of 4,490 voting districts.

Morale Lower In North Korea

WASHINGTON (AP) — Civilian morale in North Korea is so demoralized that the majority of the population would welcome a United Nations offensive to end the war, a Defense Department analysis said Tuesday.

It added that should such an offensive develop, "the United Nations Command would meet either civilian cooperation or at the least passiveness on their part."

4 Silverton Candidates for Council Lead

SILVERTON — Partial returns from all of Silverton's city precincts early this morning showed four candidates substantially out in front in the race for the four seats on the city council.

Leading the pack of six candidates were Norman Eastman with 387 votes; Harry Carson, 343; James Hollingsworth, 286, and Earl Hartman, 283. Trailing were Erickson, 232, and William Hanson, 204.

On the basis of these partial returns the two mill tax proposal for city library maintenance appeared to be losing ground slightly with 538 No votes and 531 Yes votes cast.

Fighters in Korea Hope Vote Result Means Hope

SEOUL (AP) — Thousands of American GIs in Korea listened to radio results of the U. S. election today and some voiced the hope that the next President would be the man to get them home.

Gen. James A. Van Fleet, commanding ground forces in Korea, had his ear "glued to the radio," an aide said.

Medford Mayor Leads Brother

MEDFORD, Ore. (AP) — Medford's mayor Diamond Flynn was leading his brother and another opponent Tuesday night for re-election.

Mayor Flynn had piled up more than the combined total vote for his brother, Tom Flynn, and the other candidate, Jack Swayze.

A proposed Jackson County initiative measure to forbid all experiments in weather control such as cloud seeding for rain was losing, 1643 to 1451, with 18 out of 84 precincts counted.

Secret Service To Protect Ike

NEW YORK (AP) — U. S. Secret Service agents took over the protection of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower early Wednesday shortly after his election as President was assured.

Under the law, the Secret Service is assigned to guard the President and his immediate family at all times. The protection also extends to the President-elect.
