Hearst's Son, Marion Davies' Husband Stage Sidewalk Fight

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. (U)—The movie colony's latest sidewalk fight pitted publisher William Randolph Hearst Jr. against the husband of Marion Davies, his late father's woman friend.
Capt. Horace Brown, seagoing mate of the former movie star and longtime friend of the late Hearst Sr., gave this version:
"Bill made a filthy remark about Marion and I swung."
Hearst, publisher of the New York Journal American, denied making any derogatory remarks about Miss Davies and said the scuffle started because he declined Brown's invitation to join the Davies' table at Romanoff's cafe.
The fight took place on the sidewalk in front of the cafe during the late supper hour Tuesday night.
Hearst, 44, said Wednesday he entered the fray "stone sober."
Brown, 47, admitted that he had a few cocktails before dinner but emphasized that he approached Hearst in a "sober, friendly fashion."
"We were eating," said Brown, "when Kay Spreckels waved and said 'there's Bill Hearst.' Marion said it would be nice if we invited him to our table."
Brown, who said he had never seen Hearst before, caught up with him on the sidewalk where the publisher waited for his car.
"I told him my wife, Marion Davies, had asked me to invite him to join us at our table," Brown quoted Hearst as replying.
"I don't even care to sit in the same room with her," Brown said he then countered.
"Bill, I don't see why you feel this way toward Marion. Your brothers don't."
"Filthy Remark"
The husky sea captain, then said that Hearst "made a filthy remark about Marion."
"I swung," Brown continued, "and I didn't miss like he said. I got the sore hand to prove it. In the meantime, the parking attendant and some other patrons held me but I broke away and swung again, this time off balance."
"But this time, Hearst hit me a good one. I hit the sidewalk hard, there's no question about that."
"I got up swinging but Hearst backed away apologizing. I hit him again with a left and asked: 'Bill, why do you talk about my wife like this?'"
"Kept Apologizing"
The captain said that Hearst kept on apologizing and insisting that he held nothing personal against Brown.
Hearst said he had a bruise on his head, just above the hairline. He said he noticed Kay Spreckels

Average Age In Congress Drops Slightly

Washington—The average member of the new 83rd Congress is a few months younger than his predecessor, who was 53 when elected two years ago, according to Congressional Quarterly.
In 1948, the average age of the new national legislature was nearly 54.
The average House Member in the 83rd Congress is almost 52—nearly five years younger than the average member of the new Senate, who is approaching his 57th birthday. Two years ago the House average was 52, the Senate 56.6.
Percentages for the new Congress were figured on the basis of 428 of the 435 House seats and all the 96 Senate seats.
Ages of individuals in the new Congress vary greatly. Youngest is Rep.-elect William C. Wampler (R Va.), 28, only one year older than the minimum age set by the Constitution.
Oldest is Sen. Theodore Francis Green (D R.I.), born 85 years ago. The five youngest in the new Senate are Sen. Russell B. Long (D La.), 34, Sens.-elect John F. Kennedy (D Mass.), 35, and Charles E. Potter (R Mich.), 36, Sen. George A. Smathers (D Fla.), 39, and Vice President-Elect Richard M. Nixon, 39.
The oldest Senators, in addition to Green, all with previous service, are Matthew M. Neely (D W.Va.), 78, James E. Murray (D Mont.), 76, Pat McCarran (D Nev.), 76, and Clyde R. Hoey (D N.C.), 75.
Youngest members of the new House in addition to Wampler, are Rep.-elect Joseph F. Holt (R Calif.), 28, and Richard H. Poff (R Va.), 29, Rep. Patrick J. Hillings (R Calif.), 29, and six others 30 and 31.
Oldest Representatives, all incumbents, but one, are Merlin Hull (R Wis.), 82, Brent Spence (D Ky.), and Robert Crosser (D Ohio), both 78, and Homer D. Angell (R Ore.), Rep.-elect Will E. Neal (R W.Va.), Clare E. Hoffman (R Mich.), and Daniel A. Reed (R N.Y.), all 77.
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Voter Turnout Brings Crow Diet

NEW YORK (U)—An official of the American Heritage Foundation, who thought at least 65 million people would vote this year, will literally eat crow.
C. M. Vandenberg, executive director of the Foundation, said Wednesday he would consume the crow at Schraff's restaurant on Times Square Thursday morning.
During the Foundation's campaign for maximum registration and voting, Vandenberg promised to eat crow publicly in Times Square if the voter turnout failed to reach the 65 million mark.

Canby Ferry Launched at Milwaukie

MILWAUKIE, Ore. (U)—A new ferry boat, christened the M. J. Lee, was launched here Wednesday.
The boat, to cost \$18,000 when outfitted, will operate across the Willamette River at the Canby site on Mountain Road north of Canby in Clackamas County. It will restore service interrupted by a 1946 flood.
Launching of the new ferry comes at a time when many other

ferries are going out of operation. It is only a few miles downriver from the Willamette Ferry which will be retired on completion of a four-lane highway bridge, now under construction. When the Willamette Ferry quits, the only two others, besides the one at Canby, will be in operation on the Willamette. They are at Buena Vista and at Wheatland.
The Enegren Ferry across the Coos River went out of service Monday with the completion of a new bridge.
Six ferries still operate across the Columbia. But one of these, at The Dalles, will be discontinued when the new bridge is built.
Balmoral Castle is situated on the eastern slopes of the Scottish Highlands on the River Dee.
