

Winter Skiing Gets Started

West Slope Resorts Predict Good Season

The latest start in winter sports activity since 1933, because of late snows, came true in Oregon this fall. The first white mantle in the Mt. Hood area came just after Armistice Day.

The late start, however, gave no evidence of lack of interest from winter sports enthusiasts and spectators. And Oregon's Highway Department promised full cooperation, as in years past, to keep winter sports areas accessible throughout the coming season. Improvements and innovations at Western Oregon resorts show promise of a good season.

Ski-way (aerial tramway), takes visitors 3.1 miles from terminus on U. S. Highway 26 at Government Camp to Timberline Lodge on the 6,000 foot level of Mt. Hood.

Mt. Hood Ski Bowl, Government Camp, installing a new and experimental J-Bar type pull lift for skiers. This will give lift access to the slopes where many of the major slalom races are held on Mt. Hood. The chair lift will also operate with its 800 foot rise in 1/4 of a mile. The combination will allow a downhill run of 1 1/2 miles. Operated only weekends and holidays, December through April.

Summit Area, Government Camp, 1,000, 400, 600 and 500 foot tows in operation, fifth tow under construction. Weekend operations, December through April.

Timberline Lodge Area, A new snow tunnel will eliminate the problem faced every winter heretofore due to heavy snowfall and wind-blown snow banks around the lower terminal of Timberline's mile-long chair lift. With this new extension on the terminal, skiers and visitors will be enabled to use the chair lift every day. In addition to mile-long chair lift, three rope tows in operation at 400, 500 and 1,787 foot lengths are available. Winter sports, November through June.

Hoodoo Bowl Area, on U. S. Highway 20 at Santiam summit. Forest Service has made new trails and widened old ones from top of Hoodoo Butte. Bunny trails from the top of Hoodoo widened so as to decrease the grade. 2 1/2 miles long from top of Butte. Will operate three rope tows and 4,000 foot chair lift Saturdays, Sundays and during Christmas and Spring vacations, December through April.

Willamette Pass Area, at Cascade Summit, Oregon State Highway 58. Highway Department has enlarged the off-highway parking area to accommodate 100 cars. New entrance from parking area to the ski slopes and a half-mile ski trail from the 6,000 foot elevation with a drop of 800 feet through timber. Four rope tows in operation. Facilities include ski school, warming shelter, lunches, ski rentals, shop, touring and trails and tobogganing. Accommodations at McCredie Springs, Oakridge, Odell and Crescent Lakes. Ski busses operate from Eugene, Saturdays and Sundays, 8 a.m. Season December through April.

Mary's Peak Area, on Mary's Peak, southwest of Corvallis via Oregon State Highway 34. One 540 foot portable tow in operation. Season normally November through March. For further information, contact Corvallis Chamber of Commerce, Corvallis, Oregon.

Scholarships Offered to College Men

NEW YORK (AP)—To encourage more young men to take up engineering, the American Society of Tool Engineers is offering 10 scholarships of \$700 each to engineering students in American and Canadian colleges.

The society, which has some 23,000 production experts among its members, is offering the 1953 scholarships to college students in their fourth or fifth year who are taking subjects in the general category of tool engineering, including such courses as metal processing, tool design, plant layout, inspection and advanced manufacturing processes.

For the last two years, the society has awarded five \$300 scholarships. The 1953 awards represent an increase of more than 350 per cent in the program.

HEART OPERATION — A new operation is being used to relieve conditions where the heart muscle is deprived of blood by the narrowing of the coronary arteries which feed it. According to Cosmopolitan magazine, a vein is grafted into position near the narrowed blood vessels and becomes a new avenue for the blood to flow to the heart muscle.

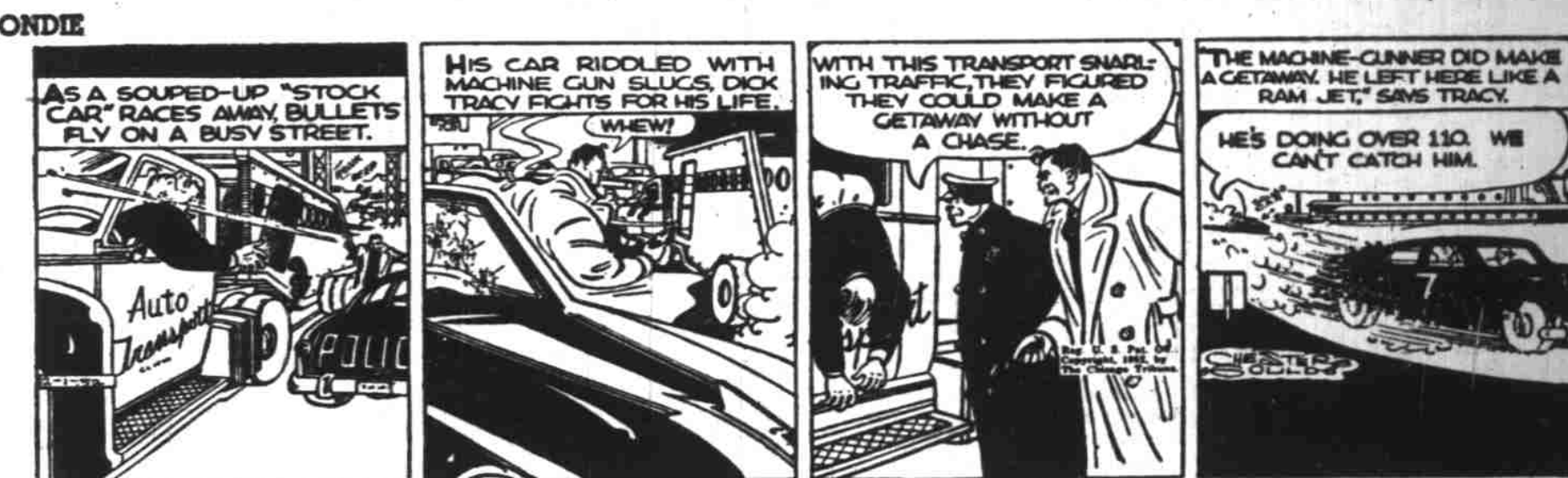
