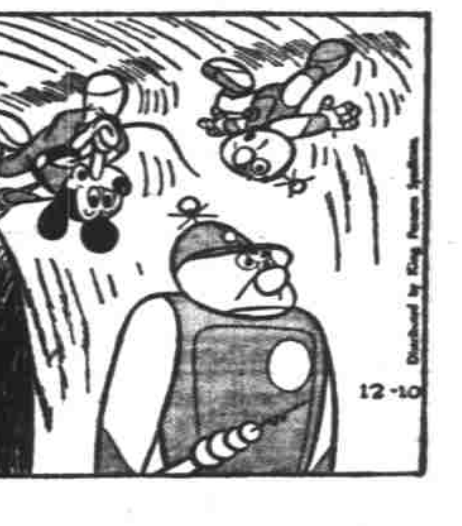
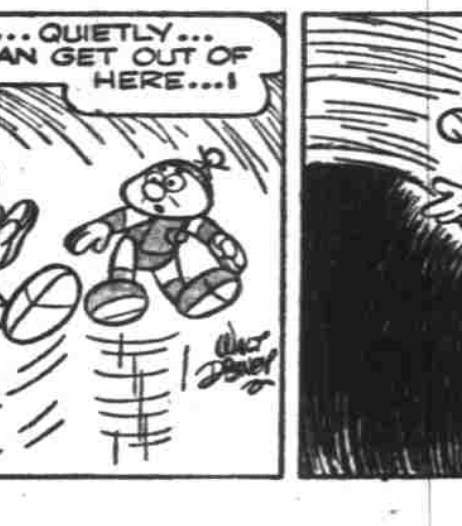
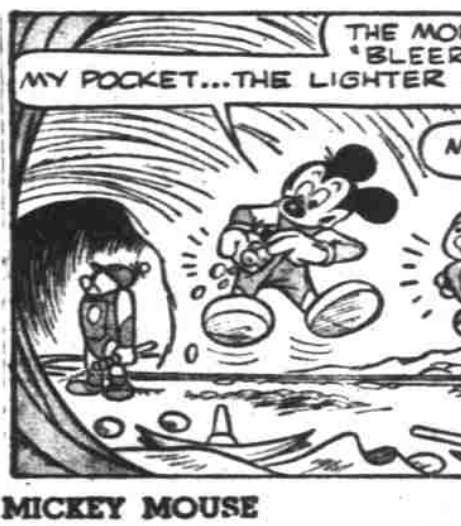

Stock Market At New High

NEW YORK (U) — Railroads and motors teamed up Tuesday to send the stock market up to its second straight new high for the year. Both of these major groups were dotted with individual new highs attained in heavy trading. Business went past the two million share mark for the first time in a week. Most gains were fractional but an unusually large number of leaders added between 1 and 2 points. The rise was one of a series since the election of Eisenhower and was based on improved earnings and dividends currently being reported. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks moved up 70 cents to close at \$113.60, a new 1952 high and the best since June 5, 1930, when the average stood at \$114.70. The industrial component of the average gained \$1.10, the railroads gained 60 cents, and utilities held unchanged. Volume expanded to 2,120,000 shares.

Wheat, Corn Head Downhill

CHICAGO (U) — Wheat, corn and soybeans led other futures downward Tuesday at the board of trade. Wheat started the decline at the opening but recovered some of its losses at the close. The market appeared to be off balance during most of the session due to lack of confirmed export business, and heavy deliveries on the December contracts. At the finish wheat was unchanged to 1/4 lower, corn was 1 to 1 1/2 lower, rye was 1/4 to 1 1/2 lower, soybeans were 2 1/4 to 3 lower, and lard was 1/4 to 15 cents a hundred pounds lower.
