OCE President Off to Make School Survey

MONMOUTH — Dr. Roben J. Maaske, president of Oregon College of Education, and Mrs. Maaske left Tuesday evening for an assignment in Turkey from which he will return April 1.

He was granted a leave of absence recently by the State Board of Higher Education to make a general survey of elementary and secondary teacher education in Turkey, as requested by the Turkish Ministry of Education through the Department of State. Dr. Maaske will headquarter in Ankara, capital of Turkey, and will lecture and conduct seminars at the Gazi Teacher Training College there.

During Maaske's leave, the administrative committee composed of R. E. Lieuellen, Ellis A. Stebbins and Dr. Floyd B. Albin will serve, according to announcement by Maaske.

Lieuellen, as chairman of the administrative committee, will attend to the president's office correspondence, attend board meetings and carry on other official assignments.
