Immanuel Men's Club Elects Melvin Saturn

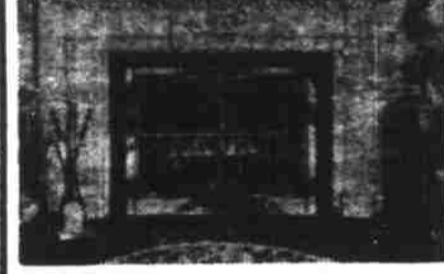


