Dairy Industry Asks Full-Time Commission

Oregon dairy interests' proposal for a full-time State Dairy Products Commission was aired before a ways and means subcommittee of the 47th Oregon Legislature Tuesday at the Capitol.

The dairy commission represented by its secretary, Frank Hettwer of Mt. Angel, is recommending a \$160,526 budget for the biennium, as compared with the current \$132,000. The state budget department had reduced the commission's proposed budget for the coming two years to \$119,000.

Hettwer said the commission plan has the backing of the Oregon Dairy Farmers' Association and every effort must be made to increase rather than reduce production.

Full-Time Executive
The commission secretary and assistant now operate on a mileage and per diem basis. The proposed budget would provide a full-time executive at salary up to \$10,000 and an administrative secretary at \$3,400.

Funds for the commission come from a levy of 1 cent per pound on butterfat produced in May and June, plus contributions from creamery operators.

Sen. Angus Gibson, chairman of the ways and means subcommittee, said he considered \$10,000 an excessive salary for the proposed executive secretary.

Considerable discussion also centered on an item of \$40,000 for use of the American Dairy Association with headquarters at Chicago. Hettwer explained that this association conducts a national advertising campaign in the interest of the dairy industry along with an educational and promotional program. It received \$15,000 from Oregon in the current biennium.

An additional \$50,000 would go to the Oregon Dairy Council for a somewhat similar program. Hettwer said programs of both the American Dairy Association and the Oregon Dairy Council had proved valuable in the past.

Gibson asked if it would not be better to spend the money assigned to the American Dairy Association with radio stations and newspapers in Oregon. Hettwer said Oregon must depend to a large extent on the American Dairy Association.

Bill Would Lift Limitation on TV, Radio Advertising

Oregon citizens who can't see the boxing matches on television because the fights are sponsored by beer manufacturers would get relief by a bill introduced in the House Tuesday by Rep. Pat Doolley, Portland.

The bill would remove the state liquor commission's right to regulate radio and TV advertising.

The liquor commission now won't allow any alcoholic beverage to be advertised on radio or TV before 8 p.m. The TV fight broadcasts generally start at 7 p.m.

Bill to Ask Hearings Prior to Addition of Power Surcharges

Rep. Monroe Sweetland, Milwaukie Democrat, said Tuesday he is introducing a bill to require public hearings before the public utilities commissioner before power

er companies are allowed to impose surcharges for steam generation.

Sweetland said he has received more mail on that subject than on any other.

Power companies now are charging 20 per cent additional to cover costs of steam generation. Permission was granted by Public Utilities Commissioner Charles H. Heltzel.

Senate Bills

S.B. 38, by committee on natural resources, by request of the state forester: Creating a forest patrol fund and a sub-account of the state general fund.

S.B. 39, by committee on natural resources, by request of the State Fish Commission—repealing the statutory provision that regulations stemming from interstate agreements covering fishing in the Columbia river shall expire on Jan. 31 of each year.

House Bills

House bills introduced Tuesday at the Oregon Legislature:

H.B. No. 88—Francis, Chindgren, Corbett, Layman and Farmer: Amends section 110-1511; relates to corporations exempt under the excise tax of 1952, primarily corporations deriving income largely from rentals.

H.B. No. 90—Anderson and Ziegler: Appropriates \$27,600 for the purpose of paying increases under the Workmen's Compensation Act; repeals chapter 88, Oregon Laws 1951, on same subject.

H.B. No. 91—Chindgren and Dammasch—Appropriates \$25,200 to compensate W. Bigelow for being slaughtered by Department of Agriculture.

H.B. No. 92—Committee on Forestry and Mining at request State Forester: Amends section 6, chapter 66 Oregon Laws 1951; declares an emergency; relates to disposition of certain funds collected for control of tree diseases.

H.B. No. 93—Committee on Physical Therapy: Relates to physical therapy.

H.B. No. 94—Sweetland and Anderson: Provides for time off for employees to vote at elections.

H.B. No. 95—Committee on Alcoholic Control by request Liquor Control Commission: Is an original bill regulating and controlling the consumption of alcoholic liquor in certain organizations.

H.B. No. 96—Anderson and Sen. Brady: Amends section 102-1780 as amended; relates to payments under the Workmen's Compensation Act.

H.B. No. 97—Anderson and Sen. Brady: Amends section 102-1756; increases certain benefits under the Compensation Act.

H.B. No. 98—Committee on Taxation: Amends section 110-1523 as amended; relates to penalty and interest on corporate excise taxes; appears largely administrative.

H.B. No. 99—Doolley: Amends section 24-106, by committee on taxation; increases certain benefits under the Compensation Act.

H.B. No. 100—Anderson and Sen. Brady: Amends section 24-103 as amended; is primarily a definitive measure; adds dispensers (spiruous liquor) to the list of taxable liquors.

H.B. No. 101—Committee on Alcoholic Control by request Liquor Control Commission: Amends section 24-118; appears largely administrative; relates to classes of licenses.

H.B. No. 102—Committee on Taxation by request State Tax Commission: Amends section 110-1829; relates to personal income taxes and appeals from findings of the Commission.

Old Well Caves In, Leaves Big Hole in Silverton Farm

SILVERTON — Mrs. Herman Gochie admits that for a brief time she was inclined to believe that the world was falling out beneath her as she gazed out the kitchen window and saw a hole fully eight feet in diameter where a short time before had been only a nice, smooth green lawn.

Investigation revealed that surface soil over a long forgotten dug well, 60 feet deep, had given away, leaving only the dangerous hole.

Gochie, out of curiosity, began inquiries of former owners including the Ray Dultums and the Mike Thompson families. The well had been in operation 35 years ago and it was recalled that a well tower and windmill had once stood over the spot.

No one could be found who knew when its use had been discontinued. The remains of 6 x 8 timbers could be seen, rotted at the ends, which had been laid across the eight-foot hole and covered with three feet of dirt. This covering hid the spot when a tractor was used eight years ago in landscaping the lawn.

The spot was boarded off immediately when discovered by the Gochies, and filling the big hole is now in progress.

The Gochies, who have owned the farm for 10 years, report they are very thankful that their small daughter, Susan, did not suffer the fate of many children who fall into abandoned wells.
